oday, we recognise the important role of Mothers in society, and in our lives. They are indispensable, indisputable and even indestructible at times. Pope Francis reminds us that mothers have a special place in the life of the Church. We know that mothers share an intimate connection with life and have a deep respect for life since they are the primary source of life. They not only nurture life, but sustain life as well. Most of all, they display tenderness, tenacity and moral strength, especially in times of trouble, said Pope Francis in one of his General Audiences.

A world without mothers would be, in his words, "inhumane because mothers always know how to give witness – even in the worst of times – to tenderness, dedication and moral strength."

I have come to recognize that **there** are no Perfect Mothers – only mothers who try to be perfect. Still we love them to bits all because they try to be perfect. of hope – they never stop believing in us when we falter and they know that one day we will succeed in life. They never stop hoping that we will turn around even when we have gone astray in the world. And they never give up on us when the world has long given up on us!

We often take our mothers for granted. Yet, we owe them immeasurably for our ability to successfully conquer mountains and cross finish lines in life. Our mother is someone who loves us despite all our flaws, fears and foibles because she believes in our strength, faith and innate goodness. I too recognised this in my own mother, who was so selfless and never thought badly of me. She gave me the self-confidence and self-esteem needed to answer God's call to be a priest when she didn't understand what it meant.

Interestingly, we forget to relate to Jesus in his tenderness and care for us as a mother would. "While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost …" (Jn 17:12). He

reveals to us – this maternal side of his care and love for us like a Mother hen standing resolutely with her wings outstretched to protect her brood from a ferocious eagle swooping down for her chicks. She is someone who worries daily about our wellbeing and safety even when we are 50 years old!

When a mother punishes her children, she feels the pain far more in her heart than the stroke on the hand of her naughty child whom she needs to discipline.

Nonetheless, they indeed are magnanimous, generous and enigmatic because God has made them so. The will continue to shine like the stars whose light never fades. We can see them clearly even when they are long gone and have been consumed by love itself. We love you for who you are! I offer all Mothers a spiritual bouquet of flowers (rosaries)! Happy Mothers Day to all Mothers!

he girl was having dinner with her former colleagues - two Buddhists and two Agnostics when the conversation turned to Catholicism and other Christian denominations. She was curious whether her friends knew the differences among the denominations and was taken aback by their responses: "Catholics worship the Mother, while Christians worship the Son. The Mother is like Guan Yin, the Buddhist goddess." She couldn't help but grin when her Buddhist friend added that her eight-year-old daughter loves gazing at Mary's statue at the church near her school, admiring Mary's gentle smile and beautiful dress.

That evening her friends learned that Catholics are also Christians who worship Jesus Christ and not His mother ... that they venerate and honour Mother Mary; and no, Mary is not a goddess even though she is the mother of our God.

That night, she pondered why Catholics love Mother Mary so much, she, who has inspired countless artworks, hymns and arias, and devotional prayers for two thousand years.

Mary is truly blessed and holy. She is the only human whom the angel Gabriel greets as the highly favoured one, chosen by the Father to be the mother of the Son, to whom the Holy Spirit comes upon, one who was overshadowed by the power of the Most High (Lk 1:26-35).

She is the "Woman" in the first and last books of the Scriptures: the one whose offspring will strike the serpent's head (Gen 3:15) and clothed and crowned with the sun, the moon, and twelve stars (Rev 12:1). She is the "Woman" Jesus addresses when He performs His first miracle in Cana (Jn 2:4), and in His final act of gifting His beloved mother to His beloved disciple – and by extension, to all Christians – in Golgotha (Jn 19:26).

Indeed, Mary is precious in God's eyes. She is the chosen one, the perfect exemplar of how a child of God relates to her Creator.

Mary responds to God gewnerously. "I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be done to me according to your word" (Lk 1:38). Even though she knows not how the Incarnation is made possible nor the path she is asked to take, she says yes wholeheartedly – a yes that she knows could cost her life. She simply trusts God. To Mary, God's will is her will.

Mary rejoices and praises the Lord. The Magnificat is one of the most beautiful prayers in the Scriptures. Mary humbly calls herself the lowly servant and glorifies the Lord for the blessings she receives – the Mighty One who has done great things for her (Lk 1:46-55).

Mary ponders in her heart. When faced with something she cannot comprehend, Mary quietly reflects and ponders in her heart. She humbly accepts that she may not grasp the unfolding

events in her life, as only faith and time will reveal the mystery of God's work.

Her petition to her Son is simple: "They have no wine." Her advice to the servants is equally simple: "Do whatever He tells you" (Jn 2:3,5). She is teaching us to be meek in our prayer with unadorned supplication – the prayer of the tax collector and not of the Pharisee – and to listen and be compliant with whatever God tells us to do, without doubting or questioning Him, for He knows what we need.

Her life is centered on her Son. Oh, what a Christian would give just to have one day with Jesus! A single encounter with Him radically changes a person's life – the Samaritan woman, the blind man, the tax collector, the leper, and many more. Three years living with Jesus transforms the Apostles, that they willingly give their lives for Him. What more of Mary who is with Jesus throughout His life, from her womb to the tomb? The overwhelming joy, the mundane days, the intense sorrow, the joyful and broken heart, she has it all. Her life is for Him alone.

Mary shows us how to live with and to love God. How fortunate we are to claim her as our Mother! As we celebrate Mother's Day today, let us remember and honour the Mother of our soul. May she continue to journey with us, to console and pray for us, to guide and teach us, holding our hands and bringing us to her Son, Jesus Christ. For she is our Lord's mother. And she is our mother too.
