Growing in Faith

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or many, our love for stories began when we were young. I recall the many instances when I was in kindergarten when our teacher, Sr Martina, would regale us with stories from the Bible, fables from abroad and more local folktales. These were for our enjoyment, but also brought with them deeper meaning that was either explained immediately or left for us to ponder, as much as our six-year-old minds could handle. I don't remember many of the stories now, but I do recall the experience – of rapt attention and the satisfaction of having heard stories

that touch one's heart while teaching one about life.

We hear Jesus teaching in parables today and that He only spoke to the crowds in parables, as "far as they were capable of understanding" them. I can imagine the crowds listening to Jesus the same way I listened to the stories when I was

a child and how the crowd would also have had the same satisfaction of having the stories touch their minds and hearts in ways that Jesus would have wanted. Jewish Biblical scholar Amy-Jill Levine wrote that most of the parables were left open by the Gospel writers to invite us, the readers, to engage with them just as the crowds would have in His time. The disciples might have had a particular meaning explained to them,

but that might not be applicable in our current day and age. Such is the beauty of stories and parables – they are largely timeless and speak to us wherever we are, drawing us into the narrative and allowing us to engage with them with both our minds and our hearts.

There is an incarnational beauty to the use of parables. Just as Jesus became flesh and dwelt among us, his use of parables makes his message understandable so that it can live with us in our daily lives. The love of stories that my six-year-old self had continues to endure and I realise that it's because

stories are like windows that open us to insights into our lives of faith. These insights are gentle in that they are not forced upon anyone and they are personal because everyone is drawn to the stories in different ways. However, if everyone has their own reaction to the stories, how are we to ensure that they're

in line with what the Lord meant? The second reading for today gives us the key to this in that we're called to "make our home with the Lord" and to always be "intent on pleasing him". If we approach the stories as means of growing our relationship with the Lord so that we can live in ways that are congruent with His love for us, then our internalisation or interpretation of the stories would be right and just.

REFLECTION

I am The Way The Truth and The Life

The parable of the seed is about the mysterious life of God within us. Jesus tells us that his presence is a gift called grace, authentic and to be accepted. We're like a mustard seed, each has its own growth and a genuine truth of who we are. We have been given the gifts and talents to share, small or big. What can you do to make a seed like you grow and bear fruit?

How do we live like Christians? We live with God's life not our own. A life lived as God would want us to live. The way we live here and now is our own way to heaven. The kingdom of God is a life nurtured by faith and God's word.


