JOHN THE BAPTIST A Fearless Friend

or most of us, John the Baptist represents the life of someone who lived in the desert with an ascetical lifestyle of prayer and self-denial in battling the bad spirits and striving for holiness—a desire to seek God and do His will. It was clear that he had many disciples in his time and Jesus would have also heard of him and allowed himself to be baptized by John the Baptist.

So what can we learn from him to take away with us? Three things: **Honesty in leadership, humility in service, and hope in adversity.**

Honesty in leadership. He was a leader who was not afraid to acknowledge his limitations and pointed the way to his disciples to follow someone (Jesus) who has more to offer when the time came. A good leader is one who has an honest ability to accept one's strength as well as one's limitations. He knew that there will be a time when there is one who is better and more worthy than himself. "Are you the Messiah, or are we to wait for the one who is to come?"

Humility in Service. The whole orientation of his life was to serve God. Hence we see his capacity for greatness and goodness when he humbled himself against vainglory and ambition. "*He must increase*, but *I must decrease*." ... John 3:30. This is the tagline for our own spiritual life. We do well to remove all that is hindering our desire to imitate the virtues and values of Christ. At the same time we need to promote all that helps us to grow to be more Christ-like

in our manner of thinking, acting and following of Him. In other words, we make use of all created things to attain this goal in so far as they help us and eliminate those that prevent us from making progress in our life with and in Christ as St Ignatius would advise us.

Hope in Adversity. This hope was already present even before his birth when the Holy Spirit moved him as a baby in the womb of his mother, Elizabeth. He was privileged to be the first recipient of Jesus' blessings so much so that he "leapt with joy." It is the same spirit that gave him courage and calmness in the face of adversity when condemned to death for speaking out against the evil deeds of Herod. For that, he paid the price with his head at the connivance of Salome in her dance that charmed Herod to make promises he would regret.

As we look into our own lives, can we see how the Providence of God guided the course of life as was the case for John the Baptist? Can we also have the complete faith and trust in God even in the midst of adversity and trials of life? Indeed, the secret to happiness in life is the ability to die to ourselves. The more we are able to decrease our ego and self-gratification and have room for Christ to increase, the more we are free to live a life of service and joy. May Christ increase and I decrease, with John the Baptist, a fearless friend.

This is the joy and fulfilment that Joseph Raj has now come to experience as he continues his ministry in St Ignatius and beyond.
