New Liturgical Practices and Procedures

Celebration of the Eucharist

Following extensive discussions and deliberations over the past two months, the Parish Liturgical Committee have refined the practices and procedures for the receipt and distribution of Holy Communion, which will be implemented at all Masses from the weekend of 21/22 July 2018.

Rationale:

- 1. To accord with liturgical norms and guidelines, it is proper that only the Ordinary (i.e. the priest-celebrant) should have access to the Tabernacle. In the event that the Ordinary is not available, access to the Tabernacle is then given to the Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (ECM).
- 2. To minimize movement within the Sanctuary during Mass.
- 3. To better symbolise the one Body of Christ, hosts to be distributed during Mass will be "freshly consecrated" and there will only be ONE ciborium (for holding consecrated hosts) in the Tabernacle. However, there will be a small reserve of hosts kept for distribution of Holy Communion to

the sick and the homebound.

Reception of Holy Communion:

By Tongue - the proper way to receive Holy Communion on the tongue is by keeping your tongue extended until the host is placed there.

By Hand – the proper way to receive Holy Communion on the hand is to place one's left hand over the right hand so that it may be picked up for

GOD'S VINEYARD: Home for the Homeless

saiah 5 says "My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones, and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes was all that it gave." What a let down, what a waste! But, this vignette has become all too familiar as we are confronted with the tragedies of the day. Once good, but not so now. Once a happy people, but now at the hands of murderers. God said, "It is good", but how, now?

In Isaiah's allegory of the fruitless vineyard, the prophet was addressing the leaders of his own day. Israel's Lord is intimately and caringly related to the vineyard. At harvest time, the vineyard has produced sour grapes, and He takes the whole establishment to trial. He expected good fruit, lasting fruit, but instead bloodshed and distress. Later, Jesus fulfils Isaiah's account in Matt

consumption with one's right hand.

Affirmation and Consumption

When the Celebrant/ECM says: "The Body of Christ.", the communicant should affirm this act of faith by responding "Amen" audibly. Upon receiving the the host, the communicant should consume it immediately. Under no circumstances must the consecrated host be consumed later or taken out of church.

Silence and Prayer

It is truly appropriate that having consumed and received the Body of Christ into one's soul that all communicants spend some quiet time in prayer and/or silent reflection.

21:33-43 by having the tenants kill the son of the owner outside of the vineyard — a clear reference to his own imminent death by crucifixion outside of the city. Isaiah and Jesus both unveil this tragedy, despite God's good work.

"Why did it yield sour grapes?" Sadly, when the going is good, when all is plenty, there looms the temptation to take matters into our own hands. Despite all God has taught us through the prophets, law-givers, even Jesus, we say, "Isn't that fruit in the garden wonderful? Let me reach for it, taste it, and take a bite of it!" From the beginning, God has thought us to respect the earth, to understand that we are mere stewards of all God has given us, and that all life has sacred. Where is this prophetic voice of love for every person, of every ethnicity, religion, and way of life?

For our parish feast and the celebratory fiesta, Jesuit Refugee Service has invited us to share in the plight of the Rohingya refugees. Each day we are updated with staggering figures, graphic scenes of losses and families torn apart. Why is this a concern for us? Myanmar is a neighbouring country. But, we cannot just say this and not lift a finger or have hearts of stone. To be a neighbour is, "when we show mercy."

These refugees are often considered other people; no names, no status, and no home. So do we merely toss a coin and walk away on the other side, outside? Or do we do much more, in giving, prayer, conversations and advocacy? This is bringing them into God's vineyard; this is what our vineyard ought to be each day. We must not leave God's suffering people outside, or worse still, allow them to be thrown out of the vineyard and killed. Bring them home ... to our home.

efore coming to iGod, I couldn't understand why

efore coming to iGod, I couldn't understand why many things happened. The events that were happening in my life were like jigsaw puzzle pieces and they were all over the place. I felt so lost and afraid that I didn't even know where to start.

However, little did I know that the next 3 days would help me with my puzzle. From praise and worship sessions and group sharings to reconciliation and being able to rest in the spirit made me realize that God is there and His love is unconditional. I truly felt His presence when we were invited to kneel before the Blessed Sacrament. Somehow my heart was immediately attracted to it, but I was scared.

After I managed to stir up some courage, I walked up and knelt before it. Just looking at the Blessed Sacrament, I felt such a strong connection words cannot describe what really

happened. At the same time I felt so guilty because how blind was I not to realize God had been next to me all this time? All this time God had always been knocking on my door waiting for me to open it. The reason why I couldn't feel His presence was not because He wasn't there, but rather that I had chosen to run away from Him.

At the end of camp, for some reason I felt that all these jigsaw puzzle pieces suddenly fit together perfectly. For the first time, everything made sense. I think one takeaway for me would be to not be afraid and trust the Lord. Even when He may not seem like He's there, He is. All I have to do is trust in Him.
