Catholic Education Sunday

celebrate Education Sunday this weekend and give thanks to all the teachers and educators who are so instrumental in forming our future generations, we turn also in gratitude to the Lord who not only acts as an inspiration for all educators but also accompanies all of us in our ordinary lives as we seek to grow in faith and love. The readings for today lead us to observe how Jesus always seeks our good and heals us in the exact way that we need to be healed. There are two points from the Gospel that are particularly relevant for us this Sunday when we reflect about education - the first is about how the ears of the deaf man were opened, and the second is the tenderness with which Jesus sighed and laid his hands on the man's ears and mouth.

Education is not about the accumulation of discrete bits of information, nor is it about being taught to do particular tasks. I believe education is about opening the mind to the world, allowing the Lord, through the work of the educator, to say to all of us "Ephphatha", "Be opened". If we were to stop at trying to accumulate knowledge and skills, we would not be able to respond to the world that is changing at an increasingly swift pace. However, practicalities aside, a Catholic educator also has the task to open the eyes and senses of the students to the marvels of God who moves and acts around us in wondrous ways. The act of teaching is thus very much like the act of healing that Jesus performed on the blind man – giving

the students the possibility to approach the world with new senses and to learn about the wonders of God in our world.

The tenderness and compassion that Jesus showed as he sighed and went on to heal the deaf man give all educators and those who are involved in the formation of others an idea of how we should act when carrying out the mission of education or formation. It's not enough to work to teach, instruct or even help open the senses of one's charges if there is no compassion and the recognition of the human needs of those who are learning. In Jesuit education circles, the phrase cura personalis is often used to describe the necessity for the "care for the whole person". That Jesus sighed and brought the man to a place where the healing would not turn into a spectacle showed the care and concern for the deaf man, a care that went far beyond the need for physical healing. The same should go for educators or formators in their work with their charges - the whole person should be at the centre and all that we do should be at the service of building up this whole person.

Aiding in the opening of the senses of others and in showing compassion are not the domains of our educators alone. Taking a cue from how the Lord always seeks to heal, let us go forth to be agents of the healing power of the Lord and to do our little part to make our world a little more open and compassionate.

My first year as a Catechist in the Weekend Catechetical Programme

When the catechetical ministry called for new catechists last year, I ventured to find out more as I felt drawn to share in the work of forming the young, so that they may grow to be steadfast and committed Christians While doubtful of my abilities, I decided to register after sitting in at a few catechetical sessions and being encouraged by catechists.

Over the past eight months as a Level 2 catechist, I have been edified by their receptivity to learning about the Faith. While they may be rowdy and inattentive at times. demanding much patience and effort to manage, at other times their energy and exuberance are channelled to an active participation and raising of questions which make the sessions lively and engaging. Sometimes, they even ask profound questions, such as "Where is heaven?" and "How big is God?" Indeed, it is heartening to observe their squeals and excitement to volunteer, their puzzled looks as they attempt to articulate or make sense of what is taught, their laughter when enjoying a song-and-dance, and their silence when reflecting on something profound.

Such moments of participation and engagement fill me with joy. It is truly a blessing to be around and to nurture these children.
