

God Has No Borders

remember when I was walking by a golf club in Australia, a man stopped me and said, "This is private, for members only." I felt irritated and discriminated.

While I could understand his reasoning of allowing members in and keeping "non-members" out, I was struck by the idea that we create a lot of artificial boundaries, lines and borders to mark out our space and possessions. My understanding was more expansive and inclusive, thinking to myself that God created the world for everyone to live in and to enjoy. It is only human beings who have divided his creation

and aligned them for themselves at the expanse and exclusion of others.

Many of us have a tendency to think that elite members have privileges and perks while the poor get to scrape the bottom of the barrel in life. The more we have, the more we try to hold on to what we have and want even more. Pope Francis invites us to think not how to be richer, but "to be a bit poorer" so that others may have a share of what we hoard which we do not need.

Jesus in today's Gospel conveys to us the attitude that his disciples are not to discriminate against those who are not from their circle. We must not allow jealousy, envy and pride to keep others away. "You must not stop him: no one who works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me." (Mk 9: 39)

Being magnanimous is to see the good that others do and to welcome them as well. It is to have a big heart to embrace the invisible hand of God at work in their lives as well and not despise what they are able to do. Worst of all, we sometimes allow jealousy to even discredit the good they do and destroy them out of envy and pettiness!

Unfortunately, jealousy is a sign of insecurity and we build walls to keep others out. However, we end up making ourselves prisoners in the process. The others are free — not we, who are burdened and imprisoned by our pride, possessions and power. Thankfully Jesus reveals to us a God who is bigger than our boundaries of insecurities and borders of pride. The kingdom of God is open to all members who believe and accept Jesus as the Son of God who has come to save us.
