To be Placed with the Son

omeone shared with me that when a couple gets married, they need to accept their parents/siblings as part of their married-love package. Likewise, in our faith, we might struggle with seeing God as Father, Jesus as Friend, or Mary as Mother. The good news is hope is with us; we can hope to grow in that relationship by seeing and receiving God's gift of love in and for us each day.

This Sunday's reading invites us to celebrate and grow in our belonging to the family of God. The first reading describes how much God loves and cares for us. "The Lord God said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone. I will make him a helpmate." God created a woman from Adam's rib and the man called "this bone from my bones and flesh from my flesh" woman, and "the two become one body." This union also becomes the foundation of Jesus' teaching about the indissoluble bond in the Sacrament of Marriage. For this reason, divorce is not permitted because the union between the man and the woman remains intact by virtue of their vows to one another. In addition, the Sacrament of Marriage invites husband and wife to witness the love of Christ, the Bridegroom, towards the Church, for eternity. The Church supports and protects the dignity of marriage by continuing to teach the total gift of self in love and forgiveness toward each other, as results of fruitfulness and holiness among families and marriages. In The Joy of Love, Pope Francis writes, "Love co-exists with imperfection. It bears all things and can hold its peace

before the limitations of the loved one." Jesus in the Gospel welcomes and blesses the children. All of us, by our baptism, are God's beloved children. The letter to the Hebrews describes this connection that Jesus became one like us, a true brother, even to the point of death. In doing so, Christ Jesus has become our leader in salvation.

October is also the month of Our Lady of the Rosary. St Pope John Paul II called the Rosary "the school of Mary", a special devotion that teaches us about the close relationship between mother and son, Mary and Jesus Christ, For through the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful and Glorious Mysteries, we journey and pray with Mary, Our Lady of the Rosary, to follow Christ from incarnation to the glory of heaven. Praying the Rosary invites us to nurture our faith and deepen our understanding of who Jesus Christ is for us and the world. Pope Francis invites all the faithful to join in praying the Rosary this month to "join in communion and in penitence, as the people of God, in asking the Holy Mother of God and St Michael Archangel to protect the Church from the devil, who always seeks to separate us from God and from each other".

"We fly to Thy protection, O Holy Mother of God. Do not despise our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from all dangers, O Glorious and Blessed Virgin."

A deep personal experience of St Ignatius Loyola with Mary happened in a small chapel dedicated to Our Lady, in the town of La Storta, in 1537. Ignatius

had been praying to Mary that she might intercede with Jesus to obtain from the Father this singular grace to be "placed with the Son". As Ignatius and companions were praying at the shrine, it became clear to him that the Father had indeed placed him with the Son. Ignatius felt the experience of being received by Jesus - not the Jesus of the nativity, nor the Jesus of the hidden life, nor the Jesus of the Resurrection - but alongside Jesus who was carrying his cross. This mystical experience is known as the vision of La Storta.

May we learn, through praying the Rosary, the school of Mary, how to open our lives to her Son, Jesus Christ, and how to be "placed with the Son" in His example of sharing God's love with our family, community, city and the world.
