ove is the greatest power for the transformation of reality because it pulls down the walls of selfishness and fills the ditches that keep us apart." Pope Francis.

Often, A question that I get asked is, "Father, can non-Catholics be saved? My mother is not baptised and I am worried about her." This is a legitimate question and it can apply to one's brothers and sisters and friends who are not yet baptised.

What do we know about the will of God? Simply that God has come to save us! Why? Because God is love. If God is love, then all that God is and does is willed towards the good of all of us as is His nature.

When I meet people in my daily interactions, I always try to see the goodness in them and work from there. I will try to identify what is the good in them. I will see if they have the desire to go beyond their present state of life. "Do they have a hunger for doing good? Are they wanting to help the poor? Wanting to sponsor poor children's education? Wanting to promote good human values and virtues in society?" When I sense that they have this reservoir of goodness in them, I will point it out to them and compliment them on what they are doing well. I tap into their well-spring of goodness and kindness and allow the good spirit to work in them. Once at a birthday dinner, a man made an announcement to everyone present, "I am a man who can find heaven on earth in my work and family. I am grateful to God for His blessings in my life." He was not a Catholic and yet he spoke with such openess and gratitude with an intimations of divine guidance in his life. Immediately, I was moved to reply to him and said, "You are not far from the Kingdom of God! You are ready for baptism " Everyone had a good laugh.

Jesus tells us in no uncertain terms that the most effective witnessing to God's love is to "Listen", to obey the commandments of our Lord, to live out one's faith in God by loving our "neighbour as yourself." This is the meaning of our witnessing--to the practice of God's love that can be seen in what we do. Start today by identifying and naming goodness in others where they are to be found. God is there. When you find them, make sure you are there also to announce God's presence and love.

encouraged the teens to recognize and identify the qualities of the more familiar saints – John Paul II, Mother Theresa, St Peter, St Paul – in a fun way.

They explored the process of canonization, followed by research on saints who are linked to their daily lives such as St John Baptiste de La Salle (SJI & St Patrick's School), St Louis de Montfort (St Gabriel's School), St Magdalene of Canossa (St Anthony's Convent), St Francis of Assisi (Franciscans) and St Therese de Lisieux (Carmelites).

Catechists, dressed as St Mother Teresa, St Agnes, St Denis, St Joan of Arc, St Elizabeth of Hungary, St Lucy, St Paul and St Peter were "interviewed" in a special talk show segment. The session closed on the Litany of Saints, encouraging all to reflect that the saints can be our intercessors, and Mary is our greatest saint.

ST DENIS

Patron Saint: Headaches Feast Day: October 9 Birth: Unknown Death: 258 A 9th Century legend recounts that St Denis' decapitated corpse carried his head from Montmarte, Paris, northeast to where the Benedictine abbey of St Denis was founded. He is portrayed in art as a decapitated (though evidently living) figure.

ST ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY

Patron Saint: Bakers

Feast Day: November 17 Birth: 1207 Death: 1231 The prayerful Princess Elizabeth led an austere life of penance and charity, wearing simple clothing and delivering bread daily to the poor. Elizabeth used her royal position to advance her mission for charity.

ST THERESE OF LISEUX

Patron Saint: Missions Feast Day: October 1 Birth: 1873 Death: 1897 St Therese, the "Little Flower" died, aged 24, after a short cloistered Carmelite life. Her journal "Story of a Soul" was published soon after her death. Her letters and restored versions of her inspirational journals have inspired many.

ST LUCY

Patron Saint: Blind Feast Day: December 13 Birth: 283 AD Death: 304 AD Lucy, meaning "light" or "lucid," is depicted with a golden plate holding her eyes and holding a palm branch, a symbol of victory over evil.

ST JOAN OF ARC

Patron Saint: The Military and of France Feast Day: May 30 Birth: 1412 Death: 1431 At 17, Joan led a small army, winning many battles for the French king. Captured by the Burgundians and sold to the British, she was convicted of heresv and burnt at the stake. To prevent anyone from collecting relics, the English raked the coals and burned her dead body two more times, reducing it to ashes,

and throwing any remains into the Seine River.

ST MOTHER TERESA

Patron Saint: World Youth Day Feast Day: September 5 Birth: 1910 Death: 1997 Teresa arrived in Calcutta in 1929, taught at St Mary's School for girls and made her Final Profession of Vows in 1937. On September 10, 1946, she received her "call within a call". By means of interior locutions and visions. Jesus beckoned "Come be My light" revealing His pain at the neglect of the poor, His sorrow at their ignorance of Him and His longing for their love. Mother Teresa established the Missionaries of Charity, dedicated to the service of the poorest of the poor.
