ike anyone else, I too grew up with my fair staple of ghost stories, aliens from outer space, weird "green creatures", and frightening spirits with supernatural powers and human beings possessed by evil spirits. One that I remember was the rumour that the stone eagles on an entrance of a house along Upper Serangoon road, would come alive and fly at night to attack people. Often, these are exaggerations and tall tales not facts.

Still, it is obvious that humanly, we do harbour some measure of fears and phobias tinged with fascination for the extra-ordinary and the supernatural things in life. When we hear of miraculous phenomenon" like the inexplicable

"image" of Mary or of Jesus appearing on a window in a hospital in Malaysia or on the wall of some houses in Indonesia, weeping statues in Korea or the US, we almost instinctly want to go and see for ourselves.

Christ Jesus our Lord. Yet, in this Sunday's (Rm 8:38-39) Gospel, Jesus gives us his insightful reading of human nature and its tendency to be easily taken in by prophets of doom and the end time scenario. Perhaps, knowing the background to Mark's social and political context of turmoil and persecution of

the Christians can help frame the meaning of what our Lord is telling us.

Christians living in and around Rome under Nero (AD 37-68) had been the scrapegoat for the epic fire that burned in

the great stadium of Circus Maximus in Rome in July, AD 64. It was also a time where Jewish uprisings were common as they fought back against the repression of the Roman soldiers. This resulted in the destuction of the Temple in Jerusalem in 70 AD. Hence, many in Mark's community wondered if the end times predicted by Jesus were in fact quite near, especially when many Christians were cruelly treated as food and game for the wild animals in the circus.

It is in this context, that Jesus instructed his disciples about the need) for watchfulness so that they will not be caught present nor the future, nor any 🛴 unprepared for this powers, neither height nor depth, final Day of Judgment. nor anything else in all creation, Jesus continues this will be ableto separate us from. teaching by pointing out to his disciples that there are signs to look out in nature like a fig tree for the seasons and times.

end time will come, except the Father.

At our staff retreat recently, we watched a movie, "Paul of Tarsus". I was struck by the response of Paul when questioned by Maritius about his indifference to suffering, torture and death. "Do you think I would be willing to die for Christ if I had doubts?" (Paul of Tarsus replying to Mauritius, Prefect of Rome). "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord," (Rm 8:38-39).

Hence, we must not fear what is to come in life. All we need is to have love, to stand firm and hold tight to our faith and the certainty of being loved by God. All fears can be transformed into unwavering faith if we only believe and trust in God's goodness and providence and love. "How can I grow in this certainty of faith?"









A Helping Hand
