here is this Peanuts comic strip that features Snoopy complaining about his lot: "Yesterday I was a dog. Today I'm a dog. Tomorrow I'll probably still be a dog. Ohh...there's so little hope for advancement." And yet another where he complains about his food but ends up eating it anyway. How many of us are like Snoopy who feel that we are living such a "boring" or "meaningless" life, and yet we carry on as usual just the same?

Or perhaps, some of us might identify more with Sisyphus of Greek mythology, a cruel king who threatened the gods of Mt. Olympus and therefore was condemned to push a rock atop a mountain only to watch it roll back to the foot of the mountain. Then, he

trudges down the slope so as to push the rock up the mountain top once more and endlessly continue a meaningless cycle.

The meaninglessness and the monotony of life. Can we really escape it? Perhaps there is a way out. Two thousand years ago, two women did, which they experienced through interruptions in their life routines.

One, a teenaged virgin betrothed to a carpenter was given the news that she would be the mother of the Godson. She was not prepared for this. This was unexpected in her life. And more, how could such a young girl like her face the shame of being labeled a teenaged unwed mother? Will she be able to deal with the fear of motherhood which perhaps has not crossed her mind not until that moment?

At that time too, a menopausal woman, maybe already in retirement had she lived in our times, was also to have her first child. She and her husband have perhaps always prayed for a child. But somehow, after decades of unheard supplications, they have somehow resigned themselves to living their lives childless. In fact, when the news of a child was announced to her husband, he was incredulous and thus punished with silence until their son was born. His unbelief is not unfounded however. How could she, a woman advanced in years, possibly conceive a child? Will she be able to stand the mockery and the insults that their neighbors would heap on her?

These are interruptions in the lives of two women that would change not only the course of their lives but that of the history of salvation of man as
