Encountering God

n our daily experiences, most of us will find it easier to meet God in good times, rather than in bad. I hope that we have found God more easily during this festive season, as we seek and share the thanksgiving of God's abundant blessings in our life, family, community and the Church in this Lunar New Year.

Two God-moments for me in the past week were the World Day of Consecrated Life (WDCL) and the Lunar New Year celebrations. In the WDCL mass, the archbishop shared about the joy of consecrated life that is founded on one's religious vows to God in seeking evangelical perfection that adds to the holiness of the Church, and increases her apostolic zeal and work of salvation for God's glory. It was a joy to see the fifteen committed religious jubilarians, who celebrated their silver, golden and diamond anniversaries. The other moment, for most of us, is perhaps the celebration of the Lunar New Year festivial over fifteen days. We spend more time with our family, relatives and friends. This is a joyful occasion in thanking and sharing God's blessings and presence with others.

This weekend's readings also bring to light *the personal encounter with God*. Isaiah, who saw a vision of the Lord's magnificence, feels himself very small and limited. But the Lord reaches out to

him and calls him to be God's messenger, a prophet. This personal moment of God's encounter prompts Isaiah to respond, "Here I am, send me." Like most of us, St Paul himself had not yet met Jesus of Nazareth. But the fruit of his indubitable personal experience with the Risen Christ had transformed him from the enemy and persecutor of the Church of God to become the apostle and missionary to the gentiles. In fact, St Paul is one of the most credible historical witnesses of our faith today.

The Gospel recounts the first personal encounter of Simon Peter with Jesus of Nazareth. Like in our daily experiences, Jesus steps into our lives and Simon's in the ordinariness of day. Jesus uses Simon's boat and preaches the Good News to the crowds. Seeing Simon's generosity, Jesus further invites Simon, "Put out into deep ... pay out your nets for a catch." Jesus performs a miracle of the catch of fish that bridges the miracle of hearing the Good News and living it. Similarly, Christ also invites us to listen and follow Him more closely as disciples to bring joys, blessings, and a good catch for God's glory. Recognizing this miracle and encounter with Jesus, Simon realises his unworthiness as a sinful man. But Jesus's words offer him consolation, "Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch." They leave everything and

Connecting **Bible Cone** with the Word of God

energy was high as parishioners waited eagerly for Bible ConeX to start. Anyone who expresses doubts concerns that Catholics are not interested in the Bible can rest assured that we are thirsty for the Word of God, willing to sacrifice our Saturday to deepen our Bible knowledge and understanding.

The brainchild of parishioner Alex Ho, whose love for the Scripture created this program in 2007, the name Bible ConeX is rich. Originally intended as "Bible Connects" it obtains a new meaning as "Bible Conversion Experience", a tagline to the popular Conversion Experience Retreat (CER).

The program was light-hearted and fun: four presenters - Fr Esmond Chua, OFM, Fr Desmond Rowland, OFM, Fr Colin Tan, SJ, and Gerard Ee helped participants remember the "must know" verses to learn important topics. Supported by a live-wire MC, an uplifting and Spirit-filled music team and all involved in logistics, helped to make the event complete.

Fr Esmond opened with the "Eucharist - Once for All Sacrifice," drawing from Hebrews 7-11 and Matthew 26:26 (the new covenant of Christ), 14 (the feeding of 5000) and 15 (the feeding of 4000). **other parishes** Jesus extends the Passover's breaking of bread from Jewish' familial affair to the Christian communal meal. For Catholics, the Eucharist is more than just a sacrifice; it was also a thanksgiving, the body of Christ, an anticipation of the feast in Heaven.

Fr Rowland followed with a skit to home in on Psalm 14 and Psalm 53 (the psalms denouncing Godlessness) and turned them into Psalm 143 (Protoevangelium; prayer of deliverance from enemies). Fr Rowland, Singapore's first deaf priest, delivered the theme using sign language comically which drew laughter from the audience.

Fr Colin posed a question to the audience, "How do you start an evangelization conversation with a one-liner?" His offering was "Have you ever been in love before?" He also used Mother Teresa's one-liner to stress the importance of good work in our faith: "Good works are links that form a chain of love."

Gerard Ee covered the mystery of suffering, using Psalm 22, which starts with "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me" which is immediately followed by praises and proclamation

It was an early Saturday morning when 250 Catholics from **St Ignatius Church and**





of trust in God. He reminded us that praising God precedes God's answering our prayer, to have faith that God is

listening, and for us to affirm our faith in God even when we are suffering.

At the end, sensing the audience's hunger for the Scripture, Fr Colin promised that the highly popular "Guided Tour of the Bible" will be back in our parish in July.

Bible ConeX would have been incomplete without the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. And what a perfect ending it was, as the audience knelt in silence in front of the Lord, the Word we learned in our heads descended to and remained in our hearts.
