To Be One

"Father, may they be one in us, as you are in me and I am in you."

he final part of Jesus' prayer at the end of the Last Supper shows a great intimacy between him and God the Father, an intimacy that he not only demonstrates but also wants to share with every single one of us. There is a feeling of a deepening intimacy that Jesus shares with his disciples who went from being on mission together, preaching and healing, to truly being one with each other, united in mind and heart because of the bond of love that came first from the Father to the Son. It's an intimacy that Jesus wants to share with us, which requires a response of obedience and faith that too is born out of the love that we feel and the love that we seek to share.

To be one with the Father and the Son points to the hope that they have for all of us to be fully united with them, with the Trinity. The Holy Trinity shows us what perfect unity is and that is the model to which we move towards. On a more concrete level, to be one also points to us being more united as a faith community, joined by our firm belief in the love that the Lord has shown us through his passion, death and resurrection. The first and most important step in this movement towards unity is one's personal act of faith, an act of faith that St Stephen so courageously showed in the first reading in his testimony to the reality of the glory of God. While not all of us may be called to testify in such extreme circumstances, we're all called to make this act of faith in our own context. Being united with our community is probably the next important thing that we have to nurture in our life of faith — as the community is the surest sign of our communion with God and with each other. We're exhorted to be one with the Father and the Son through our life of communion with one another.

The unity and communion that develops among us is not an inwardlooking unity for its own sake, but forms part of the missionary nature of our faith. The prayer for us to be "completely one" is so that the world can recognise the immense love that exists within the Trinity and among us. Our unity becomes an efficacious sign of this love and the basis for our ability to testify to this love to everyone around. As the lyrics to a popular hymn goes, "And they'll know that we are Christians by our love", we proclaim the love that we have received from Jesus through our loving of each other. It starts simply at home and in our immediate communities, doing small things to help each other, to make the lives of our sisters and brothers more joyful and pleasant. It is these small acts of love that strengthen the bonds among us so that others, the world, can look to us as beacons of the love and unity that Jesus prayed for us to have.

The unity **to be one** that extends beyond our own smaller communities is even more important in the current global climate of divisiveness. It might seem somewhat simplistic to assume



that our little attempts to build our smaller faith communities can help in the broader global context, but one should also remember that the small communities that were united in the first centuries of the Church grew to become the Church that we know today. With our experience of love and unity within our community, we're well placed to share this message of love to others in our schools, workplaces, areas of recreation, everywhere. Just as we will see how the disciples will be sent out from their united community at Pentecost to proclaim the Word to the world, so are we called to proclaim the message of unity and love to ours. The world is in need of unity and we have the key to bring this unity to the world, one loving action at a time.

most holy day in the calendar of Christians when our Lord rose from the dead to give hope for the future and fortify the power of good over evil. On 21 April, in Sri Lanka, Catholic families were getting ready in their Easter best to attend morning mass to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord. At around 8.45am, extremists targeted 3 packed churches and 3 luxury hotels in the commercial capital Colombo with suicide bombs taking the lives of 259 Sri Lankans and foreigners. Since the end of

Three weeks after this devastating event in Sri Lanka, the Sri Lankan Catholic community in Singapore paid tribute to the innocent victims of the Easter Sunday bombing by organizing a solemn memorial service at St Ignitions church. The celebration was led by parish priest Fr Colin Tan, SJ, and con-celebrated with Fr Julian Roy, who shepherds the migrant Sri Lankan community in Singapore. With over 200 attending the service, we were reminded during the holy word of

God that we should not let our hearts be troubled and to trust in God. Sri Lanka has shown mercy towards the perpetrators and has been supporting each other during this agonizing period. In his homily Fr Colin said that we are all part of one body and that we are always under attack from those who try to create havoc or evil deeds. He emphasised that the power of good will always triumph over evil, and power of love will always overcome hate. When we are devastated by destruction we cannot give into hopelessnesss. As people of faith, we should always offer what Fr Colin calls "Spiritual First Aid".

After Mass, Angelo Perera shared how the Singapore community grieved with family and friends living in Sri Lanka. To know the fate of loved ones and to be assured of their safety was paramount in the minds of all. Angelo emphasized the importance to instill Respect, Love and Leadership in the community to overcome such devastation in future. Fr Colin invited the congregation to light 259 candles with each candle representing each victim. In the background, a beautiful composition of songs by the old boys choir of St Joseph's College, a Catholic school in Colombo Sri Lanka

made it difficult to keep a dry eye. Lovely hymns were selected for the reflections service, led by Hans Avinder and Anne Kingsley. The Sri Lankan community is thankful to Marianne Page for organizing this beautiful service to remember the victims and families in Sri Lanka.

Among those who perished were children, men and women, and it would have been easy for people to lash out with rage and revenge. However, amid the heart-wrenching scenes in Sri Lanka, we were proud to witness acts of mercy and respect shown to fellow brothers and sisters. Leaders from other religions flocked into churches to dispel the tension and to comfort the community. Places of worship of other religions were graciously offered to Catholics for services. Patience, love and respect prevailed, bringing about reconciliation. The void created by the loss of a loved one will never be filled. However, Sri Lanka is determined to heal these deep wounds and to rise again as a humanitarian nation. Your thoughts, prayers and support are needed to build Sri Lanka back to its glory and to bring smiles to the people of this lovely nation. May the risen Lord bless Sri Lanka and bring peace and harmony to the communities.
