The Worthiness of Martha's Choice

t's easy to understand that the first reading, psalm, second reading, and the Gospel of Luke this Sunday speaks of a person who is close to God, in that the person knows when God is close by, acts not to serve himself, but listen to what is present at that moment, and chooses to serve God accordingly. So figures like Abram and Mary, as well as St. Paul come to mind.

What about Martha then? Is she the lesser for her choice? That is not what Jesus says, or more importantly, does. Jesus chides her. He does not rebuke her strongly. He helps her avoid create dissent and confusion. He takes care to let her know her error of perception or more accurately, her expectations. He does not judge or penalize her, and more surprisingly, he does not ask Martha to join Mary.

The scene, their lives, must continue on. What happens next? Mary continues her rapture with Jesus, giving him her full attention. Martha gives the rest of the household and its objects the attention that she sees is necessary. This is Martha's skill, her vocation. The other choice it may be, but it is no less valuable or meaningful to Martha. And indeed, in God's eyes too.

For doesn't God leave ninety nine sheep alone in the field to look for the one who is less skilled, less obedient, who took the lesser choice? And who can forget about the prodigal son? No, Martha is no less cherished by Jesus - hence the chiding tone we hear. Hence the variety of jobs and interests, abilities and skills, viewpoints and opinions, that add colour to our days, enriching, completing, even surprising us.

Who knows what God intends for

the other, for we are not traveling in the other's shoes, especially for all their lives. The message today might not be to pass comments like Jesus did, or to point out the difficulties our own vocations might be in following Jesus - and hence expect others to do the same. No, we have our own journeys to contend with, our struggles and misconceptions. We have our own crosses on our shoulders, and loved ones to bear in our hearts. And we will never really know how anyone else bears their journey, no matter how close we are to them. All we might be is to be like Mary and contemplate God in their lives, and possibly then, by God's grace, have a little part of their journey to walk with them.

It surprises me how easily we tend to ignore other persons on their journeys, especially if we think we have made the better choice. Being in a school over my summer break has brought home how easily we don't understand the struggles children have to contend with. We've made the world scarier, tougher to deal with, very real – perhaps too real.

My parents were not rich, but they certainly knew how to hide any sense of need from us. I knew we weren't rich, but I only knew of past financial difficulties when I was about to enter university. In a way, I am grateful for the childhood allowed by my parent's diligence and discipline, fostering a calm and harmonious household most of the time. In a way, they knew what their vocations were, and didn't grumble about it, but helped each other, and us all as a family, to live ours too.
