Our Father

n this passage from his first letter to Timothy, Paul speaks indirectly of God as a father: Paul either states or implies that the Father is firm, loving, patient, respectful, and hoping deeply for what Paul might become in His love. We ourselves might look at God's love in the same way and question whether we are receptive to that love or not, whether we are truly seeking to become our Father's children or whether we go our own childish and self-centered way. Are we praying from our hearts (and not only in someone else's words)? Are we making a real effort in spite of the changes which that might call for?

Paul's response is that he is the worst person in the world because he is wilful and unfaithful in response to the Father's constant, faithful, and generous invitation and call. We ourselves also need to see where we fall in response to that question.

Luke's Gospel offers us today a longer and more concrete reflection on what our stance can be before the Father's love for us as His children. The older son is a typical first child: he grows up fast, deals with hardships, and works hard. He has never really been a child, trusting and knowing love, that profound security that surpasses accomplishment or simple merit; he is all about earning love and not about receiving it freely, not recognizing that he is simply loved without any need for him to work to deserve it. He embraces things, concentrating on his work to earn his father's love. He is not willing to love his brother and rejoice over his return: it's all about him. He really doesn't know or love his father, and while the father is always there, always loving him, this son is not ready to receive that.

The younger son is less of an ant and more of a grasshopper (if you remember Aesop's fable), and since he feels himself "entitled" he is more adventuresome and takes more risks. He too is all about himself and his desires, something like a self-centered four-year-old right down to the end, no matter how his father feels about his departure or even his return. He too embraces things rather than people, and he winds up working with the very lowest of animals, pigs.

On the other hand, while this younger son gives himself to dissipation, even to the use of prostitutes, his primary sin here is his turning away from his father. At the end of that

> dissipation he has a job, feeding swine, but he does not even have enough to eat. Jesus doesn't mention the master who doesn't even feed his servants, but that manager is symbolic of Satan, who draws us to false happiness and only reveals his profound poverty (and a poverty which we ourselves have chosen) once he has enslaved us.

> Christ also fits into this parable somewhat, taking the role of the father, rather like the Good Shepherd, but He also fits into this comparison when He "leaves" the Father out of love both for the Father and for us. He comes to us precisely to be as prodigal as the father in the parable (and even far more so) with His own and His Father's gifts. He feeds us and labors among us unclean people without ever fully receiving our trust or love, without being welcomed by His own (John 1:9-11), but when His earthly labor is complete He returns to His Father in a most glorious and loving manner and even takes with Him those who wish to live in His Father's house, an everlasting banquet and feast of joy.
