# ne of the most intractable problems in the advent of Artificial Intelligence, advanced computer technology and the spread of social media on the Internet, is proliferation of lies and half-truths — the smudging of truth.

It doesn't take very much for anyone these days to create lies, be they in fake advertisements using the names of famous people without permission to endorse and sell a product or to create "alternative facts" which are the opposing views presented from the spun and spiced versions of ideological biased statements. The unfortunate victim is Truth as we know it. And friends we know who are too ashamed of having fallen victim when they should have known better.

Indeed, not only is the public confused by the barrage of diverse versions of events, we too can easily fall victim to the honey-traps created by scammers as we find out too late that even many "intelligent people" are cheated and robbed of their money, confidential information and security.

No wonder in our Gospel this week, Jesus invites us to be alert, to be vigilant and to stand firm in our faith, and be able to separate fact from fiction, truth from

falsehood, good from evil between the leaders who jeered at him and those who supported him right to the end when he hung on the cross. Many will denounce him when it is convenient and switch loyalty for their own selfish gains. These are the ones who have, as it were, gone over to the "dark side", for anyone who cheats and lies belongs to the prince of darkness.

The police are constantly issuing advice to warn us not to fall victim to scammers, cheaters and liars. They remind us to be wary in giving away personal information, be it our bank account number, identity card number or OTP (One Time Password) to anyone including family members! Secondly, be vigilant if a stranger calls you to tell you fantastic news, good or bad, from strangers. If it's too good

to be true, it is probably not true. And if it's so bad to be fake, it is probably fake.

In Ignatian terms of discernment, we can test them out in the following ways: First, ask yourselves, "Is it likely to be from the angel of light or angel of darkness? The former, leads to an increase of faith, hope, love and peace, while the latter creates a distress in one's soul where there is a loss of faith, hope, trust and peace. In other words, you will know if you are moving closer to God or away from God; if you are inflamed with the love of God, or a coldness toward God.

To the extent that you are moving closer to God and growing in greater hope, love and trust in God, you are moved by the good spirit. To the extent that you are not and are moving in the opposite direction away from God, be sure that you are not in good company.

Similarly, we know that the good spirit operates in the light and in openness and constancy, and respects our freedom of choice. We make our choice then from the clear waters of our conscience, in the stillness of prayers and in the radiance of Christ's light and his word of truth from the scriptures. Christ is the King who frees us from the enslavement of sin and the entrapment of lies. He is the King who speaks words of truth and wisdom to bring us peace and life. He does not deceive us nor can he be deceived. Listen to his voice.

Lastly, discernment lets us know the motives from which we operate and make our choices — are we tempted by short term gains motivated by greed, empty promises, hollow fame and pride? Once we know where we stand on these things, we will immunise ourselves from falling prey to the Prince of Darkness and his underlings and agents. You can say to them, "Thanks, but no thanks." And "go away from me with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels." For I follow and serve only Christ my Lord and King. Vivo Christo Rey!

# Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Grace and Peace of the Lord Jesus Christ. As had been highlighted at the recent Parish Assembly, we are taking the necessary steps in order to address some issues arising from the organisational structure in the parish. The sole purpose of the structure is to help us accompany and build up the faith life of our community, and also to respond more effectively to the pastoral needs of our parishioners. Such an organisational structure contains many interrelated mechanisms and processes at various levels – the priests in the parish, parish staff, those responsible for ministries etc. From time to time, the efficacy of these internal mechanisms and processes need to be evaluated in order to preserve helpful practices and to dispel unnecessary burdens that tend to disrupt, more than help us attain our purpose as a community. The structure should help us and free us in order to respond more effectively to the needs of people, instead of seducing us into a thoughtless maintenance of bureaucracy, on the one hand, or a dysfunction that leads to miscommunication, confusion and strain in our own relationships with one another, on the other.

St Ignatius was quite clear that our structures are instruments which must aid our collaboration with God's labour and not so saddle us that we expend more time and energy in dealing with its internal dysfunctions. In line with this desire, and after much consultation, we are engaged in the process of making the organizational structure of the parish a better tool for our mission. Needless to say, every tool is dependent on the persons who wield it. Hence, this effort and hoped for outcome is really dependent on our generous collaboration with this desire.

We are trying to define the various centers for consultation and decision-making in the parish. The forming of the Four General Clusters – Spirituality, Liturgy, Formation, Mission – are an attempt at defining these necessary pivotal centers, besides also being grounded in the necessary components which constitute a Christian life in a community. In order that we are able to channel our energy and attention and respond to needs more effectively, the priests in the parish have each taken up responsibility for a cluster. Every consultation and decision-making in taking care of it. Please bring all matters pertaining to your ministry or office to the priest of the cluster, and refrain from trying to circumvent this process. Bringing the matter to some other authority will not be helpful and is, in fact, counter-productive.

Therefore, for instance, all communications on matters pertaining to liturgy and the sacraments in the parish should be directed to Fr Jerome, the parish liturgical coordinator/ director, and communicated through him. Likewise, all directives from the Liturgical Committee and the Liturgical Cluster and those regarding liturgy and the sacraments should only be issued by him. This is to avoid miscommunication, misunderstanding, and confusion. This basic mode of proceeding is to be applied also to the other clusters and in relation to the other respective priests in charge of them. Be assured that Fr Jerome and Fr Ravi and I meet every week in order to discuss matters pertaining to each cluster in order also to accompany one another.

Many thanks for the magnanimous response and support from you as individuals and ministries already so palpable. Let us pray for the grace to live in that freedom that is able to use the instruments and tools that the Lord has blessed us with in order to ensure that His greater Glory and the salvation of persons in our care are more clearly and steadfastly pursued.
