Sharing God's Favour on Us

(Lk 2:40)

uring the joyful festivity of the Lunar New Year, we wish our family members, relatives and friends – *Gong Xi Fa Cai, which literally means I wish you more goodness and greater wealth or blessings.* As people of faith, we do so joyfully in heart-felt gratitude to God, who is the source of all goodness and blessings in our lives. We are also called to share God's favour on us joyfully with others and our world today.

This weekend, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the temple. This feast is also known as the Feast of the Encounter, and is celebrated 40 days after Christmas as part of the Jewish cultural and religious celebration of presentation and purification. The Holy Family of Nazareth brought the child Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem and presented their firstborn son to God as prescribed by the Law of Moses. In thanksgiving, they offered what they could, a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons. Meanwhile, prompted by the Spirit, Simeon and Anna recognized God's presence in the person of Jesus Christ as the fulfilment of God's promise to Israel and the light enlightens all nations. The letter to the Hebrews affirms this blessed occasion that Jesus Christ is "a compassionate and trustworthy high priest of God's religion". In his love and solidarity with us, Jesus shared our humanity, flesh and blood, suffering and death. Through his

self-sacrificial love on the cross for us, Christ Jesus has atoned human sins and becomes the source of grace and wealth in the life of the believers. This event of the presentation of the Lord is also the fulfilment of the prophet Malachi's prophecy that the Lord God has entered his Temple to bring newness of life. We are blessed in our baptism to become the dwelling temple of the Holy Spirit. We celebrate and remember God's encounter, ritually as Candlemas, where candles are blessed for use in the Church and at home throughout the year. These blessed candles remind us of the living presence of Jesus Christ, the Light to enlighten all nations and the glory of his people. Led by God's grace, both Anna and Simeon recognized the coming of salvation through their encounter with the child Jesus. Their faithfulness is blessed with this joyful encounter in their life. In return, they give thanks and praise God on this joyful lifetime experience of new life and peace.

This weekend is also the *World Day* of *Prayer for Consecrated Life*, which was instituted by St Pope John Paul II in 1997. We are called to be grateful to the vocation of consecrated life, where women and men consecrate and dedicate their lives to love, praise and serve the Lord God in all things. They have generously offered their lives to God and serve the People of God. Through this way of consecrated life, they choose to live in the prophetic
