Under God's Watchful Gaze

oday's gospel follows the beginning of a longer passage in Matthew (chapter 10) of Christ's instructions to His apostles, His mission for them. the passage we read today is a compilation of 6 separate teachings, authentic words remembered for *us* by the disciples, but not necessarily all spoken by Christ at a single moment. I'd like to treat them in a slightly different order than the one in which they appear in the Gospel.

"Jesus said to his apostles, 'Do not let men intimidate you"

"Do not fear those who deprive the body of life but cannot destroy

the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both body and soul in Gehenna"

Those words are fairly obvious and refer to the verses preceding today's reading. I must ask where my deepest value lies, where my heart really is, and whether *I* myself am the one I must fear.

"What I tell you in darkness, speak in the light. What you hear in private, proclaim from the housetops"

This is not the same as the previous statement. Christ's teaching is personal, for each of us, but it applies to the world, and we need to make known the good things that God has done for us. Catholics are not good on gratitude and praise, and we need to not only praise God in the quiet of our hearts, but must witness aloud and in public to how He treats us. We must share how generous and compassionate God has been to us.

"Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed and nothing hidden that will not become known"

On the one hand, we must let the love that we feel or seek inside, reveal itself in who we are and what we do on the outside, but at the same time what we profess to be exteriorly must drive and constantly refresh the people that we actually are within our minds and hearts. A good rule of thumb: expect what you say and do to appear on page 1 of the newspaper — but do not limit that rule to what is visible; let it apply to who you are inside, your invisible desires, thoughts, and efforts.

"Are not two sparrows sold for next to nothing? Yet not a single sparrow falls to the ground without your Father's consent. As for you, every hair of your head has been counted, so do not be afraid of anything. You are worth more than an entire flock of sparrows"

Christ would have done everything He did even if there had been only one of us to save. But if we say that, there remains the mystery of how we can then even exist, people broken and in pain, mentally or physically handicapped, with abused childhoods. And this is just what Jesus is talking about: the sparrow falls, but God cares and will save. This is where the maturity of our life is bent on placing ourselves in God's hands rather than on screaming abuse at a God who lets us suffer. God is wiser than we are and refuses to be overly protective. We need to learn to be responsible and take charge of our own lives, for only then can we truly hand ourselves over to God in love.

"Whoever acknowledges me before men I will acknowledge before my Father in heaven. Whoever disowns me before men I will

disown before my Father in heaven" this refers back to all of what has preceded.

When you come right down to it, this is all fairly obvious. As in Christ's final discourse in John's Gospel (chapters 13-17), Jesus calls us to be in the world, but not of it. He missions us to be His presence to all.
