aul uses the word "flesh" in two rather different ways here. On the one hand, he means our simple nature as humans, created physical beings with bodies and such fleshly needs as food and sleep; and on the other, "flesh" can signify for him a view of reality which is limited to the merely material: the only things that count are what I can see or feel or touch.

What Paul says, then, about the spirit (small s) corresponds to the first of these, where we realise that there is more to our fleshly existence than the merely animal part of our nature. Spirit (with a capital S) refers to how God calls us to get beyond our limited earthly vision and to reach out eagerly and generously to the fullness that God created human life for.

In the light of the Spirit's revelation to us of who we are, we recognize that we have *always* existed in the mind of God: Earth is physical, concrete, and has time, but we have always been and will always be present to God, who lives in an eternal *now*. At the time which the Holy Three thought best, we took on that earthly flesh, a life which should not be aimed at itself but be the springboard to eternal life for all of us, the first stage of a life that will change radically, with God's loving help and our choices. From a human point of view, all starts in the flesh and, from God's viewpoint, all starts and ends in the Holy Spirit.

If we put our efforts and wealth into the externals of our earthly lives — and that can be anything from toenail polish to a suntan to plastic surgery – or maybe a more expensive suit, a newer car, or a bigger house – instead of centering on our internal lives, we have entirely missed the point. In that case, we take our flesh in Paul's worse sense, limited to

the merely material; what I can see or feel or touch. As we age and lose our bodily strengths, as we find our bodies creaking and falling apart, the true people that we are become clear to the world; it is then that those people who depend only on the material, only the show, only the sensation, discover their utter poverty, their complete failure as human beings.

From a simply human standpoint, our life *seems* to be only a journey of growth outwards, towards greater strength and power and control for ourselves, but it is actually what is within us which is important, what life is all about: love, an active concern for others, wisdom, humility, generosity. After all, who are the people that we admire the most? What is it that we like or love about them? It is not their achievements, their good taste, or their money, it is how loving and kind they are, how like Christ and His saints.

We need to have bodies, just as wheat needs a stalk or a foetus needs a placenta, but that is not what we are about; our life is so much greater than this merely physical side of our existence. We need to use our bodies and our lives to become the people God wants us to be, to let our bodies be those so necessary placentas which we leave behind once they have served their purpose. We need to choose to be spiritual people in the best senses of the word, and that is what the Spirit is calling us to: not to hate the body, but to let go of it and all it ties us to.
