Good Soil and Excellent fruits

any of us may find it hard to connect to agricultural imagery when Jesus speaks of the Parable of the Sower or of the Fig Tree or the Mustard Seed. Yet, they are important means by which Jesus is able to win the hearts and minds of His followers allowing them to "listen" and ponder on the deeper significance of His messages.

Indeed, what we miss living in an urban city is our connection with nature and the countryside. When I visit other countries where I can see land full of orchards with exotic fruits like cherries, pears, persimmons, kiwi fruits, peaches and apples -- without fail my face will light up with joy and my eyes would gaze at them with delight and wonder.

The adage is still profound, "Good soil bears good fruit." Yet, we know that not all the seeds that the sower throws will fall on good soil and survive. Some of them will be lost on path edges, on rocky patches and others, among thorns. These are the unreceptive places where the seeds will be in danger of being eaten by birds or not taking root or scorched by the hot sun.

It is only the seeds that fall on good, fertile soil that will bear fruits eventually. We know that God is the one who sows the seeds of faith and goodness in our hearts. It is up to us to accept or reject them. We can decide if we want them to take root in our hearts and bear fruit of virtue. Conversely,

we sometimes unwittingly allow the enemy to sow seeds of vices in our mind and we end up bearing rotten fruits in our lives. If they are bad seeds and bad plants, don't be afraid to weed them out!

We must be discerning and receptive to be partners of God and get good seeds from Him to sow seeds of kindness and goodness in our world. Indeed, what we sow is what we will also reap. Let us not be afraid to sow the seeds of faith, hope and love around us. If a good person with a good heart is ready to receive them, God will see to it that they will bear fruit.

The Word of God strengthens my faith and helps me to trust in God fully, especially in this unprecedented situation. Vennesa Anggono






