



f someone were to tell me that he has seen a man walking on water before, I will be very surprised and even sceptical. "Wow, that is fantastic. How did he do it? Did he use a special inflatable shoe? Did he practice tai chi? Was he a magician? Was he Jesus?"

The disciples saw Jesus walking on the lake and they were petrified. They thought that they were seeing a ghost! Still doubting, Peter said, "Lord, if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water." "Come", said Jesus. Peter got out of the boat and bravely started to walk, but he did not get very far. He started to panic and sink.

Faith and Doubt — they are constantly at play in our minds. Indeed, life holds for us not only possibilities, but also potentialities. All of us have abilities that are given and built into our bodies with all their capacities and possibilities. We are endowed with gifts and talents that are sometimes explicitly expressed or lie latent, waiting to be brought to the surface. We know that what is possible can be turned into reality when we have faith to believe in God and in ourselves.

But sometimes doubts enter our lives. Many people can become

victims of their social environment, cultural mores and prejudices. "Women can't drive", "This is a job not open to Chinese", etc. Racism and discrimination can divide society and undermine human dignity with our inherent rights bestowed by God. These can never be taken away from us. We know that societal

norms and expectations can place strictures on us, stifle our creative spirit and hinder our potentials to achieve our dreams.

When was in primary school, I was very interested sports and athletics. I tried the long jump, but my teacher did not select me for further training. I did not make it into the volleyball team either. I tried out for soccer too, but again the coach did not choose me. With no opportunity for training of any sort, it was not easy to develop my interests and latent potential. Thankfully, it was later in tertiary education days that I found my talent to become a sprinter and represented my school. Better late than never. Before that, I often doubted myself and asked if I would ever be good at anything.

Jesus invites us to believe in ourselves. He does not doubt us at all. He sees the best in us and calls us to "walk on water" with him. If we believe in him, we can do all things through him, he who inspires and strengthens us. We have to drum the mantra into our heads: "It is possible (faith) and I can do it (potential)." I must learn to trust in Jesus and even when I doubt myself. Jesus will always be here as a safety net to catch me when I falter and start to sink. All I have to do is let him pull me up and not make it difficult by struggling and kicking away. Better still, I can walk even when the waves are strong!

To all Singaporeans, I wish you a very Happy National Day. Keep praying for our nation and our leaders, and walk on water with Jesus!
