Be A Rock Not a Stumbling Block

f there is anything that shouldn't surprise us, it is how often we can trip over ourselves and fall over many things in life. Over decisions, over relationships and over remarks. Often our words can be misheard or misinterpreted, and taken out of context, causing misunderstanding and even anger.

I remember accompanying the former Archbishop Gregory Yong in 1987 to our first Youth Rally at Toa Payoh Stadium, to review the displays of the Catholic organisations that had set up booths there. When I came to a particular booth, I innocently made a remark, "This is a powerful organisation." In my mind, it was a compliment, but the leader of that group took offense and felt insulted at what I had said in front of the Archbishop. He wanted to rebuke me for my comments and made a complaint against me!

Peter in our Gospel this week, was put in the hot seat when he tried to get ahead of Jesus to block His path in suffering grievously in Jerusalem at the hands of the religious leaders who were determined to get rid of Him. Jesus already predicted His own agony, death and resurrection. But Peter was not going to hear any of such things as he and the others did not understand the plan of God in saving us in this way of the Cross, that seemed to them to be a bad idea. It was incomprehensible. Yet, Jesus was firm in His commitment to fulfill the will of God and strongly rebuked Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's."(Mt 16:23).

Peter, who was declared by Jesus in the previous Sunday's readings as the Rock on which He will build the Church, has suddenly become a stumbling block. As a follower, his place is to walk behind the Master and not stand in front to block His way.

Sometimes, we allow pride, ignorance and insolence to get the better of us in living out our Christian faith and we trip ourselves and fall. What is worse, is that we make others, behind us, fall as well!

Out of this fiasco, Jesus brings out an important lesson to His disciples and us -- the lesson of love in self-denial and self-sacrifice. "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life, will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, will find it." (Mt 16: 24)

Indeed, the world has nothing worthwhile to offer us — neither power, money nor pleasure will satisfy us. Only the love of Jesus and doing His will can bring us peace and joy as St Monica had prayed with tears for the conversion of her son, St Augustine, *"For my part, my*
