


Jesuits and Liturgy

oon this liturgical year will come to an end after the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King, in the 34th Week of Ordinary Time. In the new liturgical year, Advent comes to prepare us for He who comes as "Word Made Flesh". In the Ordo (latin) for the celebration of mass and the liturgy of the hours, you will find your way through the year, from season to season, and special remembrances of saints and blesseds, commemorations and holy days. This liturgical resource will be available for the Archdiocese

and you will find your prayer map for the year. As we are a Jesuit parish, there are also special days unique to the Society of Jesus. Last weekend, in the midst of weddings and Final celebrations, Profession Jesuits from our community recited Midday Prayer at our columbarium recalling the deceased Jesuits of our community and beyond. As a Jesuit parish, we are invited to share in this rich heritage of the Society of Jesus. A Journey of Faith

t has been 22 years of journeying which culminated in the Profession of Solemn Final Vows of Fr. James Tan SJ last Sunday at the 12:15p.m. Mass. The Mass was presided by Fr. Colin Tan SJ who received the vows

on behalf of the Superior General of the Society of Jesus in Rome. Fr. James shared that it was 29 years ago at the Catholic Youth Congress when he met Fr. Paul Tan SJ (now Bishop Emeritus Paul Tan SJ) that started his journey of discerning a vocation to the Society of Jesus. It happened a week before his 17th birthday. Indeed, the journey to becoming a full member of the Society of Jesus was a long and arduous process for Fr. James, but he had many companions who helped shape the priest we now have today.

In his Thanksgiving speech, Fr. James paid a moving tribute to his mother who allowed her youngest son to enter the Jesuits. She was the one who tilled the soil in his heart and nurtured him to become one who would eventually accept the call to become a Jesuit. He also shared how his late father planted the seed of priesthood within him. The gathering of fellow Jesuits, Priests and Religious, youths and young adults of St Ignatius was testament to the many lives Fr. James has touched. As founding father of the De Vita Christi (DVC) Youth Community in our parish, he finds great joy in serving youth and seeing them grow in their relationship with God. He does not serve Jesus alone but with his fellow Jesuits and lay collaborators who support the mission of the Society of Jesus. We are privileged to have shared this momentous occasion with Fr. James and will offer him our prayers, as he continues to serve the Lord and His Church for the greater glory of God!
