Between the humility of the saints and the arrogance of the sinner is a deep valley where many have fallen. I learnt in primary school the saying, "Pride goes before a fall." I had very little clue what that meant then. Little did I realise that it has guided my conviction to live in humility since.

I had shared with the catechumens, at my RCIA class the lesson about the fall of man – original sin comes from the disobedience and pride of Adam and Eve that led to their fall from grace, and to be exiled from the Garden of Eden and God's friendship. They were deceived by the devil to eat of the tree of knowledge. Here, we see the origins of sin in the heart of man — to be proud and haughty and wanting to be like God —

as if they wanted to stage a coup and overthrow God, and put a false god on the throne instead.

In fact, this is the tripwire that many have unwittingly kicked against all the time and set off the enemy's ambush party coming to take them down. The booby trap of idolatry and pride can come in the form of big egos, un-forgiveness, in revenge, and in flaunting of one's power, wealth and possessions with no regard for the plight of the poor. For the Pharisees, it was their attention seeking stunts and being in the limelight that blinded them to the needs of others around them. Jesus reminds us so simply and authoritatively: "The greatest among you must be your servant. Anyone who exalts himself will be humbled and anyone who humbles himself will be exalted.' (Mt 23:12)

We hear him telling us in another instance, "It is easier for the camel to pass through the eye of a needle that for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." (Mt19:24) This eye of the needle is a reference to the narrow gate in a city which prevents enemies from attacking them. At any one time, only one person can enter through this narrow gate. A rich man tends to be overweight and has many possessions, and will find it difficult to enter as such! Similarly, pride makes a person so puffed up that the gate of heaven is too

small for him to enter! As we move to All Souls Day on Monday, we are invited to remember

Monday, we are invited to remember to pray for the repose of the souls of our loved ones. It has always been our Christian duty and charity to pray for

> the dead. If they are already in Heaven, no harm done; if not, every prayer is a relief for the souls in purgatory. They can draw on the treasury of merits of the saints and the Church offered for their salvation by the death

of Christ and His redemption on the Cross, that has opened the gates of Heaven to us. Thomas Merton sums it up very well: "Man cannot save himself, no matter how heroic may be his sacrifices, without Christ. But on the contrary, once the sacrifice of the cross is seen as our true salvation, then even the smallest act of charity becomes valuable and precious in the sight of God — even a cup of cold water." (The Monastic Journey, Pg 20).

Don't forget the poor and when we give a cup of water, give it with love in the name of Christ. When given with love, the water will taste like wine!

ONE-TIME CHANGE OF PARISH CHURCH

With effect from Saturday, 17 October at 0900 hrs, our Catholic faithful will be able to make a one-time change of their parish church via mycatholic.sg under their *myProfile* page.

In response to the many requests made, this now onetime option to register at a different church - will meet the various personal considerations of members of our community.

In order to qualify for the change of a parish church, please ensure that you meet the following criteria:

1. You do not have any upcoming bookings in your current parish church.

2. Your previous booking was more than 14 days ago.

3. You have not attended a Mass in person in the last 14 days in any church. This is an extra precaution to prevent potential cross-infection.

Please note that after a change of a parish church has been made on mycatholic.sg, you will not be able to make a further switch to another church. At the moment, this is a one-time change.
