think many of us would have pulled an overnighter at some point in our lives, staying awake for an entire night because of work, school, or other related reasons. I've had my fair share of such experiences, and I can attest to the fact that they're neither pleasant nor very good for us. Sometimes we put ourselves in such situations because of procrastination or poor planning, but sometimes, they're part and parcel of the responsibilities that we have, things we endure because the objectives warrant them or because we just need to get the job done. Here, staying awake takes on a very practical bent, and we are willing to go through the trouble and discomfort because it's the pragmatic thing to do. We hear the common Advent theme of "staying awake" and being ready for the coming of the Lord in today's Gospel, but this comes from a very different place and it would make sense to consider what being awake and ready could actually mean to us during this season.

We stay awake for a variety of reasons, not just the practical, and when we look at what it means to stay awake in the light of the season of Advent, I believe it's important to consider the quality of our staying awake. This quality has two aspects — our intentions and our dispositions. When we stay awake, we

need to think about why we do it, being aware of our desires and objectives as we sometimes have to fight the urge to go to sleep. Additionally, our dispositions are also important as how we go about staying awake can have effects on the quality of our actions and interactions with others as well.

In approaching our intentions for staying awake, it's important for us to recognise that ours is not a pragmatic faith. The celebration of Christmas is the celebration of the incarnation, God coming to live among us as a human person. This occurred not out of any practical reason, but out of God's love for us - God wanted to accompany us in a real and very concrete manner. Given that God's intentions were not pragmatic but born out of love, our intentions for staying awake and being prepared for God's coming among us should be the same. Having love at the heart of our intention for staying awake would make all the difference because the difficulties that would come with being alert and not falling asleep would pale in comparison with the love that one would feel for the one we're waiting for. All our Advent practices would have a much deeper significance if we are clear about our intentions and focus them on our love for the coming Saviour.

The dispositions that we have while staying awake flow from our loving

intentions. I'm a person who keeps a fairly regular sleep schedule and because of that, I tend to get grumpy and fairly cranky when I lack sleep or have to stay up past my normal bedtime. Without the proper intentions, one's disposition would follow one's normal inclinations but when our intentions are pointed towards the Lord and welcoming his loving presence into our lives more fully, our disposition towards him and others would change. There would be a big difference in disposition between one who grudgingly stays awake to perform a task and those who choose not to sleep in order to await the arrival of their loved ones. The crankiness gets transformed into care as we orient ourselves towards God and those we love, better disposing ourselves to welcome them and to return their love.

Our waiting and staying awake makes sense because we're irrevocably drawn to God, creatures drawn to the Creator. The prophet Isaiah so beautifully described this as the relationship between the potter and the clay, and that we're all the work of God's hands. We all have the Lord's imprint all over us, and that makes us want to orient ourselves towards him, staying awake and waiting patiently for him to come, knowing that the potter's loving hands will continue to shape, mould and comfort us now during this season of Advent and beyond.
