dvent is a time of inbetweenness. Ordinary Time has ended, and the coming of Emmanuel is ahead of us. It is also the end of the academic semester, assignments have to be handed in, and classes are ending, possibly even the end of a program of study. In the university, students have not escaped the reach of COVID-19. Some are in quarantine or isolation, for contact with a COVID-19 positive person or are COVID-19 positive themselves. Some are even graduating from such conditions. Economically, small businesses and manual workers risk losing their shops and homes, a devastatingly impossible setback for some.

In Massachusetts, the gathering darkness hastens each day with a growing cold in the air. Trees and plants have lost their leaves or dried up. Most of the birds have flown away. Daylight skitters quickly through the time we used to recognize as day. Bulbs lie dormant, the earth becomes bare and dry. Yes, on top of everything there is a drought in effect.

Weeping and wailing can easily scar this half of Advent, and the next. In the perceived darkness staining our observable human existence, weeping and wailing would not be out of place. We cannot be happy about the suffering that is happening. We cannot morally accept suffering that causes injustice to the self or to others. We cannot ignore the all-too-human costs of being pawns in a machinery that has run away from us, as each person claims only to be the next anonymous cog that does not make a difference, just a little dot amongst the

inky blackness of a dark and frightful abyss of our post-truth society.

For an atypical people, the people of God who are repenting, who await the coming of the Messiah, this weeping and wailing is not just a lament for the suffering of the innocent, the poor and the marginalized. More importantly, such remorse can be motivated by a fear of God, a fear of not meeting the promises of God. A fear of the judgment of God, who governs with justice.

Our God is also a God of loving mercy. This unity of paradoxes – God who serves justice with mercy – is one representation of the mystery of God. God who incarnated as Jesus Christ so as to be among us, to take part in an irreplaceable and unique experience. God who remains just beyond our grasp, yet always inviting us to know him better through his life, death and resurrection. He who entered the dark of the tomb, the dark crevasse into hell, to know and wrestle with the darkness that has plagued human beings since Adam.

The psalmist seems to know what darkness is. For the first and second weeks of Advent we ask God for vision to lighten the darkness surrounding the people of God. While we strive for the light of Christ, do we ever realize what we pray for in our prayers for perpetual light in our afterlife?

## WAITING AND WATCHING FOR

Do not be misled by pedestrian observations that being perpetually under a spotlight is uncomfortable. St John of the Cross described a darkness terrifying and total, a dark night of the soul that St Teresa of Calcutta might or might not have experienced. This darkness can only be so dark because the overflowing and full light that is God is so utterly overwhelming. Likewise, we condemn this profound darkness of our times because we know the blessed lightsoaked life that haunts our memories.

The worst darkness is not always visible or felt. When a person doesn't show any sign of sadness or distress, no one can know his difficulties, let alone empathize with him. When people stay away from each other, who knows how the other person is doing? How do we give comfort to each other? How do we even know who to give comfort to when the people of God are out of our minds as they remain out of sight?

This season of Advent, especially in these challenging times, calls for greater community, greater solidarity, greater being Christ for each other.

The challenge is not to attend to such a call in-person, but more intentionally and specifically by physically-distanced words and actions.

The challenge is to be humble and accept these restrictions, to learn a new way of listening and speaking in order to reveal and share the life of Christ within us.

The challenge is to humbly face our uncertainties, and be more dedicated to risk more, not because the danger is there or the risk is to be disdained, but because the call to be Christ for others rings louder and truer than the silent fear in our hearts.

The challenge is to live our faith, simply, truly, without fanfare, with greater costs, with less returns.

The challenge is to exercise our faith, as a pinprick of light standing before a tide of blackness, and to reach out in solidarity to that other unknown, solitary and struggling light.

The challenge is to believe, again, that there will be light once more.
