My Soul⁶

n last week's first reading, Isaiah charged someone unnamed to announce the time of salvation, the coming of Jahweh's Kingdom, and now (in Isaiah 61, "Third Isaiah") we have the song of that individual, whom we know to be Jesus. It is for this reason that we call today Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday, but the words of Isaiah also describe us when we are at our best.

In today's second reading (1 Thess 5), Paul says that we should rejoice in Christ's coming, and also in our own mission, which is part of that coming. Being Christian is far more than just following the Ten Commandments and going to church on Sunday: it is a standing back from total control of our own lives, an emptying of ourselves. It is letting God come to fill us and to direct us as He wishes.

Think of Mary in the words of today's Psalm reading (I translated some of her words into more modern terms, and these are in the parentheses):

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord (Who and what I am gives praise to God) and my spirit exults in God, my Savior, Because He has looked upon His lowly handmaid (He looks favorably on my nothingness). Yes, from this day forward all generations will call me blessed (because) the Almighty has done great things for me. Holy His name! His mercy reaches from age to age for those who fear Him.

And the rest of Mary's words are fairly clear in that light.

Taking seriously what Paul and Mary say leads to our becoming ourselves the same sort of heralds of God's Kingdom which Isaiah describes in what we are, what we choose, and what we say. That is our becoming lights in the darkness of this world by our emptying ourselves in our following of Christ and becoming mere human vessels bearing God's light to the world – and in doing that we reach out to become more truly human, more actually our true selves.

Advent is the time when we celebrate God's coming to us in human form and interacting with us in a most human manner; at the same time we seek God in turn by opening ourselves to receive His coming, not only by recalling and celebrating His coming to us once in history, but even more in His doing so specifically today, in who and what we are, each of us. There is no better way to do that than to let down our defenses, to lay all that we are before God, and to ask Him to change what He wishes. He will of course indicate (very gently) what that is, and He will make subtle changes in us, but He will not do that work of changing our lives all by Himself; He will help us to discern His will, and He will help us to make that change as best we can with His help.

In our loving submission to God's love we will discover Him in discovering the deepest truth about ourselves: that we are the most blessed children of God – created specifically to devote ourselves to grow lovingly into the image of the Firstborn – constantly forgiven and called to life in Him.
