Come, Let us

s you know, the word "advent" simply means the coming or arrival of someone or something, and during the season of Advent we focus specifically on how God comes and enters our lives. He wants to lift us up like squalling, dirty babies, to wipe away the tears of our hopelessness and our frustration with ourselves, to forgive us and to heal us, to repair what we have done to His creation, and to give us the life that He has always, always, wanted us to have.

Or we might say that He comes to continue His creation, doing what He had always planned, lifting what is seemingly only natural into the supernatural as He always intended to do. In His heart and mind, God has always had creation in His hand, under control, growing as He planned it except for sin, but that is what happens when He gives us freedom.

For God, this is all one single action. I might underline and stress the fact that what we will celebrate in a few days is the birth of the Lord, not His Incarnation. If we are going to be consistent, in the most literal sense and in line with the Church's view of abortion, the Incarnation occurred at the Annunciation – but a broader view would say that the Incarnation takes place from forever, outside of creation and time, rooted in and already complete

in the eternal "YES!" of the Second Person of the Trinity to the desire of the First Person and the Third.

That single focus, that unique project of God's nature and existence and the whole point of creation, makes all of creation history the story of God's love becoming incarnate in His creation, and that history leads to the complete realization at the end of time of that incarnation in the climactic revelation of the Mystical Body of Christ for what it already is. The death and resurrection of Christ are only a critical moment in that tale of God's yearning for us, and how He advances the coming of Christ's Reign.

Advent is the season in which we recall these deeds of God, reflect on them, and recommit our selves to a life of active gratitude. Our resultant praise and thanks is at its best a relatively feeble recognition that He is perfect and "does it right," and even then our recognition is too often intermittent, when we think of it or as part of a ritual. When we see God face to face after death, we will be blown away in amazement at what He has done and how weakly, and even sinfully, we have responded. In our awe and our ecstasy, all that

we are, will involuntarily respond to God's love, and we will then adore unceasingly: our intelligence, will, desire, virtues, senses, emotions, and even our memory will be a source of joy and thanks and praise.

I say involuntarily, but it is the result of our constant small choices in our preceding life on earth, and at our death we will suddenly find that we really are doing what we had always asked for and tried to make real. When we get to that point we will glorify God for everything, even for our sins, since we have been led to finally and fully understand how we could turn to God and find His mercy and love. Only then will we truly understand and appreciate just what His love has done for us.


