any years ago as a Jesuit scholastic in Dublin, Ireland, I had to write a final term paper for a Scripture course, based on the actual words recorded in one of the four gospels. I took on the gospel of Mark which is one of the shorter gospel, recorded all the spoken words of Jesus, and later wrote my reflection on them. If you were to ask me what I had written for that term paper, I have to say, "I cannot remember any of it"! However, the experience of noting and writing down the exact spoken words of Jesus was memorable for me, or what I would call a "Kairos" moment. In Greek "Kairos" means "the right, critical, or opportune moment".

Today as we celebrate Sunday of the Word of God, we have three readings related to the word "Kairos", where in the 1st reading from the Book of Jonah, the people of Ninevah were called at the critical moment to repent from their sinful ways, and they did iust that in the nick of time before the imminent disaster. In the 2nd reading from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, like them, we too are rightly reminded that the present world as we know it is fast passing away. Thus, we should focus or set our sight on things that truly matter in life, that is, our faith and trust in Jesus Christ. And in today's gospel, we have the call narrative of the early disciples, which was an opportune moment for them to respond to the invitation of God in Jesus. They were called to be the

first disciples, to help build up the infant Church, as well as to preach the Good News to all people, based on their personal encounter with the person of Jesus Christ. In short, to share their faith journey and experience of Jesus.

What has this "Kairos", this critical or opportune moment have to do with us today as disciples of Jesus Christ? For a start, you may want to select a passage from any of the four gospels, or if you are more ambitious, to take the whole gospel and write down all the spoken words of Jesus. What you need to do next is to reflect on them in the days and weeks ahead, taking a word, phrase or sentence, and allowing those words of Jesus himself to speak directly to you and your heart, as "heart speaks to heart".

Gradually, as you allow the words of Jesus to speak and touch you during your quiet reflection, it will become a "Kairos" moment for you. You will begin to see things differently, not only from your own perspective, but with the eyes of faith and the perspective of Jesus Christ. Knowing what is truly important or essential in your lives, as in the words of the famous French writer and aviator,

Antoine de Saint-Exupéry in his book The Little Prince, "What is essential is invisible to the eyes", like love, faith, hope, and charity.

Let me conclude by quoting these words of Jesus found in Mark's gospel today, "The time has come", "and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News". "Follow me and I will make you into fishers of men". Indeed, the time has come, our "Kairos" moment is here! We are called to live our lives worthy of our Christian vocation. The right, critical and opportune moment has arrived for us to actively participate in the life and mission of Jesus Christ as we begin this New Year 2021, trusting and hoping in the love and providence of God to enable us to be who God wants us to be, beloved children of God, and heralds of the Good News of Jesus Christ, both in words and deeds.

Mindful too that "The Spirit continues to guide us in our translating the Good News into different contexts, so that the words of Jesus continue to resound in the hearts of men and women in every age." (Pope Francis, "Let us Dream", p.45)


PARISH DIAMOND JUBILEE

Sunday of the Word of God



What is Sunday of the Word of God?

Sunday of the Word of God was formerly known as Bible Sunday, traditionally celebrated in July every year.

Does it replace Bible Sunday in July?

Yes, it does. In his Apostolic Letter Motu Proprio Aperuit Illis issued in September 2019, Pope Francis establishes the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time as Sunday of the Word of God in the Catholic Church.

What is Aperuit Illis about?

As one of the final acts of our risen Lord Jesus Christ before his Ascension to heaven, we are told in Luke 24:45 that "He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures". He then promised to send the Holy

Spirit, who would give strength to the apostles to be witnesses of his saving mystery (C.f. Luke 24:49).

Our Holy Father Pope Francis wants to remind us that the relationship between our Lord Jesus Christ, his Church and sacred scripture is essential to our identity as Christians. We are thus asked to ponder "if the Word of God takes flesh in our heart and in our life?"

How should we celebrate Sunday of the Word of God?

As a community, we are encouraged to specifically enthrone the sacred text during Mass on this day, to celebrate the Rite of Installation of Lectors or commissioning of Readers, who proclaim the Word of God on this day. We are also encouraged to present the Bible

to the entire assembly as a way of showing the importance of learning how to read, appreciate and pray daily with sacred scripture.

How can I personally celebrate Sunday of the Word of God?

On a personal level, there are many things that we can do to celebrate this day:

- We can commit to take up the study of the bible by joining one of many bible study programs conducted in our parishes or within the Archdiocese.
- We can make a conscientious commitment to read the Bible or one of the many scriptural based prayer booklets and to reflect upon the word of God.
- We can commit to share our love of the Word of God with others in our community.
