Listening to Jesus



he theology of childhood describes how Jesus relates with children and reveals images of a Loving God. Although children enjoyed their families' affection as a gift and blessing, they were considered to be of lower social status in the biblical tradition. Children were vulnerable and subject to severe discipline but Jesus' attitude toward them is counter-cultural. Jesus rebuked his disciples, "Let the children come to me ... for to such belongs the kingdom of God." (Mk 10:14)

What Jesus did is to bring children into the center - to be seen and heard, not ignored and silenced. Jesus' welcoming and blessing children expresses his desire for their well-being and how we should treat them with love. Jesus wants us to be like children. Unlike adults who are self-reliant. and makers of their own 'salvation', children can teach us about trust and openness to receive the kingdom of God. Children can be the model of how people should behave and live with one another in God's family. Like children, adults can put their trust in the goodness of God's welcoming love as our Father.

Demanding the sacrifice of Abraham's only child Isaac seemed contradictory to God's promise to him. It is shocking in today's culture.

But, this narrative tells us about the sacrifice of Abraham of his future dream and how he responded with gratitude and trust. Abraham knew that God can be trusted. He understood all is gift that belongs to God. Likewise, St Paul assures us, "With God on our side who can be against us?" God has given us the gift of His only Son, Jesus Christ. God did not spare his own Son. Jesus not only died for us, but He also rose from the dead, and so at God's right hand, He stands and pleads for us. Indeed, God's dream is bigger than ours, and God's love is a greater love that redeems and gives us a new life.

In the Transfiguration, Jesus invites his friends and us, to the mountain-top experience where Moses and Elijah appeared with Jesus. Moses, who led the Israelites from slavery in Egypt and received the Ten Commandments. represents the Law that guides the lives of God's people. Elijah was one of the great prophets who helped the Israelites stay faithful to God, and whose return some Jews believed would signal the coming of the Messiah. Their appearance signified Jesus' continuity with the Law and the prophets, and that Jesus is the fulfilment of all the promises to God's people. The voice that came from the cloud further affirms Jesus' identity as "the Beloved Son". Jesus further instructed his disciples not to tell anyone until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. Without witnessing Jesus' passion, death and resurrection, the disciples might not understand Jesus' Transfiguration.

At the beginning of Lent, Pope Francis told us, "Lent is the proper time both to journey toward God and toward our brothers and sisters." In journeying and deepening our relationship with Jesus, we realize that "salvation is not an ascent to glory, but a descent in love". We are called to experience and share God's personal love for us in our Lenten journey.

Biblical language The "touching" and "laying of hands" is also the language of blessing and of bestowing the goodness and salvation that comes from God. In Baptism, we become sons and daughters of God. In welcoming and putting children at the center, Jesus assures us that we are the object of God's love and affection. No matter our age, we have a place in the heart of our Father. Our Lenten journey invites us to discover our identity as God's beloved children who listen to Jesus Christ, His Beloved Son, and remain in His Love so that we can discover a greater dream and experience God's glory.
