Building a Community of Harmony

hat idols have you carved out for yourself? Growing up, I was driven by passionate curiosity. Once, as I was becoming fascinated with the notion of a budding scientist in me, I put together a device made up of random electronic parts and connecting wires. I plugged my new creation into a power socket to see my scientific achievement at work. It glowed and brought a smile to my face, shortly before a minor explosion ensued. It tripped the fuse box, landing the entire house into darkness. People at home were not the least amused with my precocious scientific feat. The little failed experiment, however, made me all the more resilient in wanting to discover how things are wired to each other in nature in order to function properly.

One cannot put things together concocted according to one's own whims and fancies and needs. Idols are carved out of our experiences in which things are wired wrongly, made up of false connections that create life-

traps, a pattern of thinking or judging or behaving that shortcircuits the fuse box constantly and lands your entire house into darkness. And, the idol beneath our thinking which we cannot see is more radicalized than the molten calf worshipped in broad daylight, because when the idol opens its eyes in order to see, it makes us wire things to each other wrongly in a manner which appeases the real fear or rage or vengefulness, which must remain hidden. It takes a lot of mental, physical and spiritual energy to keep things together wrongly against their natural flow, or when the connections we are making between things are foolish or weak. We generate fanciful connections and enforce rigid behaviors, because our idols are breathing.

Jesus knew the self-oppressive manner in which people were holding things together through the carved-out idols pumping their hearts, like the den of thieves in the middle of the temple. They had turned God's free relationship into some

deeply hidden unperceivable and unnatural self-centered gain by demonizing guilt and shame, and spiritualizing it in order to exploit the vulnerabilities of others.

But, idols are rather resistant. When you try to undo an idol, people often have outbursts of aggression and anger. It is like an explosion of energy which burns the fuse box and turns the entire house dark, exposing the fact that there was never genuine harmony and light there to begin with. When building community, we must be weary of putting things together erroneously, or they will explode at some point, because things cannot be held together in an unnatural way - through a short-circuiting impulsive spirituality of concealed darkness. The idol unleashes pent up forces; God harmonizes into growing freedom.

Lord, help us gather things together in a manner which enlightens the eye, and that rejoices the heart, and refreshes the soul.
