On Sanctification, Separation and Mixing things up

t the risk of always talking things related about food, this week's reflection begins with an observation about two extremes in the way some of us eat. I know of some people who will never mix the various foods on their plate, preferring to taste each item individually, often going so far as to say that we do not honour the intentions of the chef. At the other extreme lie those who insist on mixing all their food on a plate or bowl and enjoying it all at once, saying that the whole is greater than the parts and that the magic of eating is in the mix of flavours. My position lies between these two extremes. I also feel that taking the middle path between complete separation and complete mixing can be a healthy stance for our spiritual life as well.

The idea of separation is quite integral to this weekend's gospel passage. It comes from what is often referred to as Jesus' Farewell Discourse in the Gospel of John. Here, Jesus prays for the sanctification of the disciples, strengthening them in unity as they go out to spread the good news, glorifying the Father and the Son in the process. To sanctify something is to set it apart or to make it holy and while Jesus did not ask for them

to be removed from the world, he did pray for them to be consecrated to the truth and to be able to be protected from the untoward influences from the world. In those days when Christians were relentlessly persecuted by the authorities, the separation and prayer for protection made sense. But would this continue to be relevant for us today?

Sanctification always relevant as it's a reminder that we're in the world, but not of the world. By our baptism, we have been set apart, saved by the Lord and commissioned to proclaim the good news of this salvation. This is not a separation in the ordinary sense and we should not think that this makes us better than others. Our salvation should never make us feel superior or arrogant. Instead, we should seek to savour and relish this salvation, deepening our relationship with the Lord who saves us, tasting this reality through our own journeys of conversion. In this way, just like those who seek to taste foods in their purity, we will be able to savour and relish our sanctity as a means of preparing ourselves to be fully immersed in the world.

And fully immersed in the world we should be. The advantage of having had the opportunity to delve

deep into our relationship with the Lord before this immersion means that we go with the confidence that we're consecrated to the truth and that the Lord is always at our side. This not only lessens the struggles, but allows us to be the leaven that brings the good news to others. This is where the mixing comes in. Part of the beauty of our earthly reality is the diversity that we have - the multitude of people and perspectives that make things interesting, but sometimes difficult for us as well. By being immersed or mixed into this world, we need to rely on our sanctified selves and the sure taste of salvation that comes from the Lord so as not to lose our bearings or feel threatened by it. We need to be mixed in to spread the good news, to help bring this taste of the Lord to those who may be longing for it.

Our lives of faith are all about savouring and mixing, being separated and sanctified yet being fully immersed in the world. As we prepare for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, let us seek to ground our relationship with the Lord so that we can be strengthened to bring this message of salvation to the ends of the earth.
