

A Call to Have Faith

risis calls us to respond with courage. When situations are beyond us, as in a pandemic crisis — when we wait for the results of an application to a school or for a job, when doctors do not know what the cause of our illness is, in spite of all the extensive tests, or when we are caught in an accident that is life threatening — we can either respond in fear or with faith; with hope or in despair.

God calls us to respond. We don't really have to do very much. We just have to show up and God will take care of everything. Jesus tells the father of the daughter who has just died, "Do not be afraid. Only have faith."

Jesus sees things that we cannot see. He sees death as a sleep. "The child is not dead, but asleep." (Mark 5:39). The crowds laughed at him. They did so in mockery and thought that he was mad for plainly they could see that she had died. Often, when we want to do something surprising, something out of the ordinary, people think we are

mad or stupid. They can laugh at us. But we know that the results can prove us right.

Placed in such a situation, Jesus invites us to have only one response — have faith. He doesn't need us to do anything else.

I wonder when does a person have that kind of faith? When all else has failed, when all help is exhausted, and the best doctors can't do anything more? To whom do we turn to? What else do we have? If there is faith still left at the bottom of the barrel, well and good.

Pope year, Francis encouraged us to have faith in God when he spoke in his address "Orbi et Ubi" (To the World and Cities) on 27 March, 2020, at the beginning of the Pandemic. "Like the disciples, we will experience that with him [Jesus] on board, there will be no shipwreck. This is God's strength: Turning to good everything that happens to us, even bad things. He brings serenity into our storms, because with God, life never dies." - Pope Francis.

These words of faith from Pope Francis are powerful and inspirational — "with God, life never dies". It seems to me that there is a reality that we have failed to notice — that God does not want us to die. From our first reading in the Book of Wisdom, we read with assurance: "Death was not God's doing, he takes no pleasure in the extinction of the living. To be — for this he created all." (Wisdom 1:13-14)

Let us remember that we are made for God and to be with God for all eternity. Jesus affirms this to us when he restored life to the child with his words of life: "Talitha Kum!" which means, Little girl, I tell you to get up!

When we are down, when we are confused and lost, when we are tired, Jesus will call us to get up. He will call us to have faith. It is his work, not ours. His words are powerful, and they are life. What more do I need? What is my response? With faith or in fear? With hope or in despair? You hold the key to your answer.

JULY MASS BOOKINGS

Stage 1 Mass bookings for July opens on 29 June at 3pm via myCatholic.sg. Parishioners will be able to book ONE weekend Mass and up to FIVE weekday Masses at each stage, subject to availability.

We are happy to announce that our parish will pilot the introduction of Masses to accommodate 170 pax* for specific Mass dates and timings to allow more parishioners to attend Mass. The Masses are as follows:

- · Sunday, 18 July, 12.15pm
- Sunday, 25 July, 12.15pm
- Saturday, 31 July, 6.00pm (Feast of St Ignatius).

All other Mass capacity remains at 50 pax.

*Do note that in order to attend Masses above 50 pax, the pre-requisite by authorities is that individuals must undergo pre-event testing (PET) or have received two doses of the Covid-19 vaccines (Pfizer or Moderna only). Entry will be denied if you fail to produce the relevant test results or proof of vaccination.
