

# Can you keep your word?

reputation and often character are marked by our sincerity, honesty and integrity or the lack of them, in our dealings with others. My teacher in secondary school used to tell the class, "Self-praise is no praise, but an international disgrace." If we want to be respected, we have to keep our word and be humble, not trumpeting ourselves and our achievements.

In the Gospel reading this weekend, we see that even the followers of Jesus struggled with His teachings. Jesus had said to them in the earlier text, "I am the living bread that came down from Heaven and whoever eats this bread, will have eternal life. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world... For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in them." (John 6:51; 55-56)

It would be scarcely credible to believe in this. But Jesus assures them in today's Gospel: "It is the spirit that gives life, the flesh has nothing to offer. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life." (John 6: 64)

If Jesus were merely bragging, we would have doubts about the authenticity of His teachings. Would Jesus magnify His claims out of proportion to its real importance and reality to be believable? So we have to come to a faith conviction about Jesus. We have to ask ourselves. Is Jesus believable? Is He a man of His word? Can I trust him?

If we trust Jesus, we have no reason to question what He offers of Himself to us, as the "bread of heaven" to give us a share of eternal life. Only God can make this promise and keep His word. In good conscience, I can make an assent of faith and obedience to our Lord and say with Peter, "Yes Lord, I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." (Matthew 26:63)

Similarly, the people of God were challenged by Joshua to make a choice to obey and follow Yahweh. They responded with great conviction: "We have no intention of deserting the Lord our God and serving other gods." (Joshua 24: 16).

It is all well and good for God's people to say this. But the issue is whether they can keep their word. It is always better to ensure we do not make promises we cannot keep.

We know that time and again, we will break our promises, disobey God and rebel against Him. Yet God does not forsake or abandon us, but continues to win us back by His faithfulness and love for us sinners.

This is the Good News — that we are loved NOT because we are worthy, but that God is always greater than our own weaknesses and infidelity!

PET/ Vaccinated-only Mass timings: **Saturday 6pm, Sunday 10.15am (NEW) & Sunday 12.15pm**Capacity for these Masses have also been increased to accomodate **170 pax.** All other Mass capacity remains at 50 pax.

Children aged 12 years and below may also participate in these Masses without testing or vaccination. However, please note that they may only comprise up to 20% of the total Mass capacity.

The **booking**/ **cancellation cut-off time** for Mass bookings in September have also been reduced from **3 hours to 1 hour**.


