Overcoming the 3 Sins of the World

ost Singaporeans want to achieve a successful career and have a good life. The question is at what price? In the pursuit of riches, honours and pride, many would have been beaten, discouraged and lost their way. St Ignatius tells us that these three vices are the means by which Satan tempts us and leads us to other vices and finally to our downfall.

We begin by looking at how people, by coveting riches and wealth, become enslaved by what they possess. In succumbing to the lure of riches, they displace God from His rightful role over creation, and replace Him with an inordinate desire for possession, often at the expense of friends and family relationships.

When they have their riches, they will also covet honours from this world, honours which often carry superficial and empty promises of power and glamour. For wealth inevitably attracts the adulation and admiration of society by setting apart those who have it and those who do not. But without God's blessings,


such honours fade away like the morning dew.

In the end, pride will blind us to the needs and dignity of others. For riches and honours will lead to a false elevated sense of self-importance. The result is a haughty pride and desire to maintain one's privileged status and sense of entitlement without adequate consideration of the plight of others.

As Christians, we follow the way of Christ, which is the way of humility, obedience and poverty of life which brings with it freedom and joy.

This weekend's Gospel reading shows how Jesus gives a lesson in simplicity and humility from the wranglings and petty arguments of the disciples as to which of them was the greatest.

He tells them clearly when he takes a little child to the front of them and says: "Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes not me, but the one who sent me." (Mark 9:36-37)



It is clear then that the way to being a true disciple of Our Lord is the exact opposite to our enemy's. Jesus invites us to be poor so that we are rich in Christ; to be small in the eyes of the world, but big in the eyes of God and to be humble as Christ was humble and obedient to the Father's will even by dying on the cross. It is by this cross of love that he shows us how to overcome these 3 sins of the world. Only when we are free and detached from riches, honours and pride, can we be truly happy.
