Perfect Love by the Triune God

Uring a parish catechism class when I was in Primary Three, our teacher gave us a series of questions about God and the Holy Trinity. One of the questions went along these lines: "I am able to understand the Holy Trinity. Yes or No." Not wanting to seem ignorant, I wrote "Yes, I understand." The little exercise book was returned to us a week later and to my utter horror, that question was marked wrong and had these words written beside, "No, I do not understand the mystery of the Holy Trinity."

I could not understand how such an innocent question could have an answer so baffling. The earnest Singaporean schoolboy in me was appalled that a question could actually have ignorance as part of the answer. I didn't understand the answer and carried this with me all this while. I revisited those thoughts during my class this past semester on the Holy Trinity and realised how brilliant my teacher's answer is. It captures the essence of our relationship with the Trinity and gives us a clue as to how we can approach this mystery.

The Holy Trinity is a mystery. A mystery is not a gap in knowledge or something that's steeped in esoterica. Mysteries are part of life, realities that we encounter, but cannot quite understand rationally. Like, why we get along so well with some of our friends despite great differences, why we find sunsets so beautiful, or just trying to explain the experience of love. Utterly real, yet so difficult to wrap our rational minds around. That's how God is a mystery to us too. Incredibly real, but difficult to approach completely rationally because of our human limits in trying to comprehend God, who is complete unity yet completely distinct in three persons.

However, just before we completely give up in our attempts to approach our triune God, the other part of my teacher's response brings hope. The admission that "I do not understand" brings with it the humility to accept our humanity and the openness to accept the love that God brings. The Holy Trinity is love and shows us how perfect love is love that is shared. While we might not fully understand how the three persons in the Trinity are perfectly united yet perfectly different, we know that the love that is shared in God is the same that we experience. The same shared trinitarian love is seen in our families, among friends and in our faith community. We may not fully understand in our minds, but we can know God, triune and love, in our lives as we grow to love God and others in fuller and more real ways.

Harmony of the Trinity (John 3:16-18)

The human brain, command centre of our nervous system, receives input from our senses and sends out commands for our body to work. Neuroscientists have discovered that our brain has three main parts. First, the reptilian brain steers the body's vital functions -- heart rate, breathing, body temperature and balance. Second, the limbic system controls our emotions. Third, the neocortex allows us to think, plan, rationalise and learn. Each part does not operate independently, but works together in unity.

efore our Lord Jesus Chist suffered and died on the cross for our sins, He left us the most sublime of gifts by instituting the Eucharistic sacrifice of his Body and Blood "to entrust to his beloved Spouse, the Church, a memorial of his death and resurrection"¹.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us several things about the Eucharist:

 It is the source and summit of Christian Life.² The other sacraments, Church ministry work and apostolate work are all linked with the Eucharist and oriented towards it, for our Blessed Lord, Christ himself, who is source of all spiritual good of the Church, is present within it.³
 Through the Eucharist, communion between God's divine life and His people, the Church is maintained. God blesses the world through Christ and at the same time, man worships the Trinitarian God through Christ.⁴

3) "Finally, by the Eucharistic celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all."⁵

The Church encourages us to actively build up a love for the Eucharist as it is the "sum and summary of our faith".⁶

And so, on this very special month where we worship our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, the parish of St Ignatius has organised a series of special

For it is when we take time away from our busy schedules to spend quiet time with our Lord, that He comes to meet us and nourish us in a personal way. Our Holy Father reminds us:

The personal relationship which the individual believer establishes with Jesus present in the Eucharist constantly points beyond itself to the whole communion of the Church and nourishes a fuller sense of membership in the Body of Christ. For this reason, besides encouraging individual believers to make time for personal prayer before the Sacrament of the Altar, I feel obliged to urge parishes and other church groups to set aside times for collective adoration. (Sacramentum Caritatis 68, Pope Benedict XVI)

Let us make this month of June a special time for us to grow closer to our Lord in the Eucharist and rediscover the joy and peace which God meant for us. For through this, we would be able to experience the liturgical celebration more fully and more fruitfully.⁷
