he Society of Jesus is an international religious Catholic order. Individual members are in communities, belonging to provinces or regions, and these belong to a conference. I belong to the Dependent Region of Malaysia-Singapore, in the Jesuit Conference of Asia Pacific. Directing the entire Society is the Jesuit Father General, who is assisted by and works with not only the presidents and representatives of the different conferences, but also the Curia (or head office, if you like) with its various sections, in Rome.

In our Region, we can be spread wide geographically due to our individual missions. Communications – digital or otherwise – are important to relationships, be it between superiors and members of the community, or with partners from other organisations, locally or abroad. Such means of communications even enable peer groups to exist.

Honestly, I am more at home with local dialects and slang. I can't deny my own context. However, other people's contexts are just as important too. I still do speak Tetum occasionally, or reply to messages from my former Timorese stu-

dents. For example, during my on-going student visa application, the rector of the college abroad I was applying to had to re-arrange my Malaysian Chinese name based on my feedback to him. Meaningful, expedient communication enables things to happen correctly, and timely, if we are open and courteous about it.

It's often truly the inspiration of the Holy Spirit that facilitates these exchanges, in the form of timeliness, connections, or content, including inspired sharings. I won't say that I have a Holy-Spirit-filled life, but there are moments. Enough for me to acknowledge that we don't need that hyper-connectedness to each other all the time, through all various means available to us.

We need the me-time, the God-and-me time, and then the everyone-and-me time. It's all part and parcel of being in this created and Spirit-filled world, and we need to listen and comprehend not only our own hearts, but also God, and others. May the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ remind us of this blessed connectedness we live in.

the Second Vatican Council in the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy Sacrosanctum Concilium (SC), called believers to "fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations", they clearly did not intend this to be limited to times of worship. Rather, the bishops in the Council saw "participation" as a way to describe the whole Christian life. This whole way of life coalesces in the Liturgy, while Liturgy gives us the strength and shows us the way to live the rest of our lives in full participation in Christ.

That participation in the mystery and ministry of Christ is described by five adjectives: full, conscious, active, internal, and external.

"Full" participations means complete, holding as much as possible, or having all distinguishing characteristics. Something that is full is not lacking anything. Most of us, most of the time, can't give our full attention to anything or anyone, nor can we become fully involved in what we are doing. There are always distractions, other things that need our attention, weaknesses, and personal failings to contend with. We need to keep focused; we need others to fill up what is lacking in our own commitment to the task. When it comes to life in Christ, the same holds true, even for the Church. As Saint Paul reminds us, it is only in Christ that the Church and individual believers reach fullness, for the Father has given Christ "as head over all things in the Church, which is his body, the fullness of the one who fills all things in every way" (Ephesians 1:23).

Our entry into Christ's fullness comes through the sacraments – through the sacraments of initiation and especially through the Eucharist, which "draws the faithful into the compelling love of Christ and sets them on fire" (SC, 10).

"Conscious" participation means that we are fully aware of what we are doing, and we are aware that we're the ones doing it. It's something that we do with our mental faculties fully alert, something that we feel deeply about. It's something we are committed to. The opposite of this form of participation in Liturgy, as in the rest of Christian life, is what Pope Pius XI called being "detached and silent spectators"

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(Apostolic constitution *Divinicultus* [December 20, 1928], IX). If we're serious about being Christian and about worship, we can't just stand on a street corner and watch the parade pass by.

"Active" participation means the

deliberate involvement of our whole being in what is going on. It is far more than mere engagement of our voices in song or prayer, far more than engagement in the "Catholic calisthenics" of standing, kneeling and processing. It is even more than making sandwiches for the soup kitchen or collecting money for charitable causes. Certainly active participation involves these things, for we are incarnate beings. We are our bodies because we are also embodied spirits.

That's why "active" participation must be "internal" as well as "external". In a way, these two adjectives simply reinforce what the others describe. Truly "full" participation is also "conscious" - it involves internal consciousness of what we're doing and why we're doing it. It also involves our intent to be fully committed to what we're doing, whether in worship or any part of our lives as Christians. But "active" participation doesn't stop somewhere behind our eyes or our hands; it requires external actions that show people who we are and enables us to put our beliefs into practice, whether at worship or any other part of our Christian lives.

The task of being Christian involves wholehearted commitment: full, conscious, active, internal and external commitment. Sometimes it's hard to make such a commitment; sometimes we fail miserably. But this is our goal and out challenge: to be fully united to Christ in returning to God, the love that was first shown to us.
