

Beating the Flu

theology professor of mine once told me that we Christians sometimes get the "gnostic flu", alluding to an ancient Gnosticism that asserts that spirit and matter oppose each other. We succumb when we believe that all things spiritual are good, and material things, bad.

Taken to its extreme, "gnostic flu" causes the affected to repudiate the material world entirely. In less serious cases, this might lead a person to a "schizophrenic" existence. Accepting that it is impossible to live a purely "spiritual" existence, the person's life consists of two distinct halves: a "spiritual life" and life in the world. The afflicted may consider whatever within the walls of the Church as holy, and whatever beyond, profane. Religiosity and piety demonstrated by his or her

reception of the sacraments, worship and devotions, are not translated into concrete expression in daily living beyond the Church.

A view that pits matter against with Christianity, particularly in the mystery of the Incarnation, which is an essential element of our faith. Every time we recite the Creed, we affirm our belief that in order to save us, Jesus Christ became human. Our conviction that the Word of God became flesh and lived among humanity (John 1:14) attests to the fact that material things are important to God's redemptive plan. Since God is the creator of all things, how can the Lord not love and value them (Genesis 1:31)? Indeed, "God loves the world so much that he sent Jesus



ope Francis' recent Pope Video (https://aleteia.org/2017/08/04/pope-francis-challenges-artists-to-bring-joy-to-a-gloomy-world/) was very encouraging to me. I dabble where I can, and it's been helpful for me in my prayers. While some who have seen what I've done have been very generous with their comments, accolades are not the top of my list. More importantly, I can't help but add that being creative (be it through art or writing) is not only a bellwether about my own spiritual life, but also a means to access my relationship with God.

The drawing, titled Puffer-Dragon, is not much larger than my hand, but completing it was much "harder" than most works of art that I had done (except for a mask I did for a competition). To be honest, painting or drawing for prayer means that an artwork is complete in an hour or so in order for me to continue to pray and contemplate. Pieces which take more than an hour become a discussion, which is more than just that occasion to prayer itself. Puffer-Dragon is one such.

Years prior, I was very comfortable using paints, crayons, and oil pastels. I start my artwork from two premises: an inspiration, or searching for inspiration. Puffer-Dragon was created during a search for inspiration, using colour pens, a relatively new medium and

evolving style for me. About a month or so after, sometime in June 2017, I was stuck. Large patches were empty, and "unsatisfying" – a shorthand to myself that signals the artwork is not complete.

The frustration and difficulty in completing Puffer-Dragon mirrored my apostolate and personal life. The foundation for all my difficulties and setbacks had most of their roots or solutions in my spiritual life. It was only during my recent annual retreat that I was able to find freedom, along with peace, to finally complete it. In doing so, I felt more peace, and more optimism looking forward to my coming theology studies in Boston, and beyond.

On the other hand, I've done artwork based on inspiration, or asking for graces. During my recent annual retreat, while settling into the retreat, I was trying to get some good sleep. One of the passages or ideas that caught my imagination was the Passion of Christ, or rather, towards the end of His Passion and before His Resurrection. That twilight moment, where things quieten down, long drawn breaths and grieving happen freely, after the height of His Passion. Hence I came up with Sleeping.

Though never in the forefront of my prayers and contemplations until recently, Mary had a very dramatic role to play in Sleeping. It's a coming to terms with grief and death, enough so as to let Jesus rest in peace. A sleep befitting Him – a quality of rest that I was asking for myself, which I did receive that night. Sleeping took slightly more than an hour to complete, using a set of crayons which I'd never used before. But it conveyed what I wanted to capture, offer, ask, and receive. Not so much about the artwork, but about my relationship with God.

In many situations, in retreats or daily life, I am glad that I have an access to the ideas and feelings that run deep within me. As a bearer of God's graces, I hope that these graces be shared and be a grace to others too. Which was the challenge that a friend threw at me recently, in asking me to promote Ignatian spirituality through them. There's a thought to consider, but I often find myself not so conceited as to work on my artwork for its own sake. In plain words, a good cause but I somewhat can't find (or feel) the avenue or time to carry it out. But in the meantime, like a pilgrim who appreciates and gives thanks for the road and its blessings and difficulties, I will continue to be inspired, seek inspiration, and hopefully, pass on God's graces to all I meet.
