

f you have met Jesus today, would you recognize him? Would you believe that he is there?

He stands attentively waiting for you to come in — opening the door for you as you walked by, oblivious to his presence. **Keeper of the gate he is.** A bellboy of sorts, who smiles at you when you are too preoccupied with your own thoughts and coiffured hair.

Maybe, he takes you to your destination even when you do not see him in the driver's seat of the train or bus as you hopped on and off safely in a hurry without ever greeting and acknowledging him. *Uber driver of sorts he is.* Still he drives on, to pick up another grateful/ungrateful passenger on the way.

Perhaps he is the chef who cooks a meal for you when you are hungry as you eat without saying "Thank you". *Master chef of sorts he is.* He knows you are hungry and famished. "Take and eat of it ..." Are our eyes opened to the divinity that hides itself?

"No servant is greater than his master ..." If this is how the Pharisees treated the Master, what more do we, mere servants, expect? To serve others is to make Jesus present in our world even when we are not recognized, acknowledged or rewarded. "Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be ..." (Jn 12:26). A divinity that hides itself also reveals itself when we serve with love and humility. That moment of revelation and surprise is when we receive a smile from a stranger, a child, a dying man or woman — from Christ who winks at us behind the door.

How am I called to touch lives as Jesus touched the leper in this Sunday's gospel? In the past month, I have been touched by many people who are serving in different capacities in St Ignatius Church. I feel like the leper who was looking for Jesus and wanting to be healed of my fears, doubts and shame and Jesus comes to me and stretches out his hands: "Of course I want

to." His love, his care, his compassion was never in doubt. I was the one doubting and hiding my true self from others.

Leprosy was a dreaded disease that ostracized a person both socially and religiously in those days. It was a social stigma. Maybe there are some who still feel this way — parents with a child with special needs, people with a different sexual orientation, children who are from the lower social strata of society, migrant workers, and the elderly who are ill with cancer, dementia or bed-ridden and isolated.

How can I reach out to touch their lives and do something small but significant? Visit them this Chinese New Year? Give them a small Ang Pow? Talk to them to hear their life's story? Or say a prayer for them? Or read to them the gospel of the day?

Who in my community is cut off? Who feels isolated? Or feels neglected? There are many people especially the elderly and sick, children with special needs, families with ageing parents who are ill, those who have left the church. They need to be touched. Can you say, "Of course I want to ..."

We are badly in need of more hands to reach out to them. There are ministries in the Church but they too need renewal, they also need new members to give them a helping hand. If you want to be the hand of Christ — come and sign up at the help desk or at the church office or talk to anyone who is in any of these ministries.


