to befriend. A danger that was a stranger to me. Once more, I cried, "Lord, save me!" How many times has our Lord heard me cry to Him, "Save me from this watery grave! I will do anything you want me to do!" (He must have had a smirk on his face and heard that desperate plea many times over from despairing souls whose promises were made, but never kept).

Would I die before my time...half-baked in my priestly vocation? Dying alone in a foreign land, away from my family and friends? The end of my vocation to be a Jesuit? A regret for getting into the seemingly innocuous sea for a swim. These thoughts were running wild in my mind as I tried to stay afloat.

A frantic cry, a desperate wave of the hand. A useless struggle to get to shore ... to dry land, to safety, to anywhere. Yet, the more I struggled, the further I was pulled from the shore till it seemed like it was the end of me! Water choked my breath and muscles drained from frantic strokes. Then as it were, a boy on a surf board came to my rescue. He arrived like an angel! I clung to the surfboard for dear life. That perhaps, was the only time I was ever on a surf board. He was my hero! God heard my prayer and I have a promise to keep.

It was in Newport beach in Sydney as a second year Jesuit Novice when I went out for a swim in 1989. As I look back, I am reminded of my own mortality, of my own brush with death ... yet again. (You may recall my desert encounter in Australia from an earlier article in the 18th February 2018 church bulletin). Perhaps, I have more than nine lives! From then on, whatever else that I have, whatever life that I would be given, from then on, my life belongs to God. My life is no longer my own. It has already been

bought and paid for.
How much did God pay for you?
How much are you worth in God's eyes?
How many times have you been saved by Jesus?

I invite you to resolutely enter into this last leg of Lent before the Holy week to be with Jesus. Stay with Jesus. Cling to Jesus. Spend an hour with Him. Pray with Him! "Now my soul is troubled. What shall I say? Father, save me from this hour? (Jn 12:27).

Jesus knew his hour had come, it was an hour, not of shame, nor of fear, but faith and glory. It was the moment that he had been waiting for — to fulfil his destiny, to accomplish the work he had come to do — his father's will in saving us, every one of us. To snatch us from the jaws of death, danger and despair. To save us from the sting of the spiritual WASP. The WASP of: Worry, Anxiety, Shame and Pride. The WASP that used to paralyze us. Now that sting has been neutralized because we can dissolve it with the ointment of Faith. We are saved by faith. "Go, your faith has saved you." (Lk 7:50) Jesus said this to the woman who was a sinner. In suffering and in faith, Jesus glorified God. We too, in suffering and faith must learn to glorify God in our lives, in all that we do and in all that we are. "It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours." May we hear this voice in our hearts - the voice of love calling us into God's friendship and life. For when we cry out, "Lord, save me!" God responds!
